

SELF DEFENSE IS DIPLEY'S PLEA

Man Who Killed Stanley Ketchell Says He Did So After Pugilist Had Drawn Revolver and Threatened to Shoot.

MARSHFIELD, Mo., Jan. 21.—Walter Dipley, the man accused of killing Stanley Ketchell, former middleweight champion pugilist, on the R. P. Dickerson ranch near here, today took the stand and pleaded self defense.

Dipley said he had met Goldie Smith months before he went to the Dickerson ranch and that the two had agreed to pass as man and wife. One day when he returned from work the Smith woman told him that Ketchell had attacked her.

Next morning he entered the ranch house and told the fighter that he would quit. Ketchell asked the reason.

"You're very innocent," Dipley said he replied and then Ketchell showed a revolver.

"Then I grabbed the rifle," said Dipley, "and shot him down."
