

WOULD ALLOW ROGUE FISHING

Bill of Pierce of Coos and Curry Provides for Sein Fishing in Rogue Below Mouth of Illinois—Willamette Also Considered.

SALEM, Or., Jan. 27.—Fishing with nets and seines will be permitted in the Rogue river below the mouth of the Illinois river, if a bill introduced in the house yesterday by Representative Pierce of Coos and Curry becomes a law. However, fishing for steelheads anywhere in the Rogue river except with hook and line will be prohibited. This act is amendatory of the act adopted by the people last November prohibiting all fishing in the Rogue river except with hook and line.

It is contended by the cannerymen and fishermen established near the mouth of the Rogue river, where much commercial fishing for salmon has been carried on for years, that the act enacted by the people was highly detrimental to their investments, and for this reason the Pierce bill was introduced in the house. It is contended by the commercial fishing interests that prohibiting the catching of steelheads will give the upper river anglers sufficient sport, and only the larger fish, such as the full grown salmon, will be taken at the mouth of the river, the smaller trout and steelhead salmon being allowed to traverse the upper reaches of the stream. The mouth of the Illinois river is about 30 miles inland from the mouth of the Rogue river.

A bill introduced by Chatten prohibits the fishing with nets and seines in the Willamette river north of the O. R. & N. company's docks in Oregon City, and provides an open season for fishing above that point between March 15 and April 1, and between June 15 and November 1. This law will prohibit fishermen from taking battered fish from the foot of the falls, according to Mr. Chatten, and putting them on the market as fresh salmon, though it extends the fishing season in the spring from April 1 to April 15, making it 15 days longer than at present.

CITY NOTICES.

ORDINANCE NO. 448.
An ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$8500.00 of the improvement bonds of the city of Medford, Jackson county, Oregon, and directing the advertising of the same for sale in accordance with chapter V of title XXVII of Bellinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of the State of Oregon.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:
Section 1. Whereas, the city of Medford has heretofore duly caused certain streets of said city to be improved, and has duly assessed the cost thereof to the property benefited thereby in accordance with the charter of said city; and

Whereas, certain owners of sundry pieces of property each assessed for such improvement in a sum exceeding twenty-five dollars, have duly made and filed application to pay said several assessments in installments in accordance with section 2727 of said Bellinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes; and

Whereas, an assessment and bond lien docket has been duly made up in accordance with the provisions of said section and of section 2728 of said Codes and Statutes, and the total amount of unpaid assessments for such street improvements and for which application to pay under the provisions of said sections above cited has been made and filed as aforesaid is the sum of \$8500.00, as shown by said bond lien docket;

Now therefore, said city of Medford doth ordain as aforesaid, that there is hereby authorized to be issued the bonds of said city in the total amount of \$8500.00, in denominations of two hundred and fifty and five hundred dollars each, as may be convenient.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be made in the following form:

IMPROVEMENT BOND

Know all men by these presents, that the city of Medford, in the county of Jackson, state of Oregon, for value received, hereby agrees and promises to pay the bearer the sum of \$..... Dollars in gold coin of the United States of America, on the presentation and surrender of this obligation, on the day of 1911, or on the day of the Lord one thousand and hundred and without grace, with interest thereon from the date hereof until redeemed, or until the time of the semi-annual interest payment next ensuing the publication of notice by the city of Medford that this bond will be taken up and cancelled, and that interest thereon will cease at the interest payment period next following such publication, at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, in like coin, on the day of 1911, or on the day of the Lord one thousand and hundred and year, on the presentation and surrender of the proper coupons thereto annexed, principal and interest payable at the office of the treasurer of the city of Medford.

This bond is one of a series authorized by an act of the legislative assembly of the state of Oregon, entitled "An act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers in incorporated cities and for the payment of the cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments," filed in the office of the secretary of state February 22d, 1893, as amended by an act entitled "An act to amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of an act entitled 'An act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers in incorporated cities, and for the payment of the cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments,' filed in the office of the secretary of state February 22d, 1893," approved February 28th, 1901, and is an obligation of the city of Medford, aforesaid, and is not to be deemed or taken to be within or any part of the limitation by laws as to the indebtedness of said city, and it is further certified that all requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers in the issuing of this bond, and that the total amount of this issue does not exceed the limit prescribed by said act.

This bond is redeemable at the office of said treasurer at the option of the city of Medford upon the payment of the face value thereof, with accrued interest to the date of payment of any semi-annual coupon period at or after one year from the date hereof, as provided by said act.

For the fulfillment of the conditions of this obligation the faith and credit of the city of Medford are hereby pledged.

In witness whereof, this bond has been signed by the mayor and attested by the recorder of said city of Medford and the corporate seal of the city of Medford hereto affixed this day of A. D. 1911.

Section 3. Each of said bonds shall have attached thereto twenty coupons, each of which shall be in the following form:

Will pay to the bearer dollars in gold coin of the United States of America, at the office of the treasurer of said city, on the day of 1911, or on the day of the Lord six months' interest on improvement bond No. unless said bond is sooner redeemed, as therein provided, which redemption will render this coupon void.

Said coupons shall be numbered from one to twenty, respectively.

Section 4. The mayor of said city is hereby authorized and directed to issue said bonds and the city recorder to countersign the same by attaching thereto the seal of said city, all on behalf of said city.

Section 5. The recorder of said city is hereby directed to register said bonds and number the same on the blank provided therefore in the foregoing form in accordance with

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section 2730 of said Codes and Statutes of the State of Oregon.

Section 6. The recorder of the city of Medford is hereby directed to advertise said bonds for sale and that the same will be sold for the highest price obtainable, not less than par and accrued interest, and in said advertisement he shall announce that he will receive sealed proposals for the purchase of said bonds or any portion thereof at his office at any time before 4:30 p. m. on the 7th day of February, 1911. He shall publish said advertisement three times in a daily newspaper published and printed in said city, and shall submit the sealed proposals received in accordance with said advertisement to the council at its next meeting thereafter.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council of the city of Medford, Oregon, on the 17th day of January, 1911, by the following vote, to-wit:

Ordinance No. 442.

An ordinance declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a 4-inch water main on Pine street from Jackson street to Austin street and directing the recorder to enter a statement thereof in the water main lien docket.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the city council did heretofore, by resolution declare its intention to lay a 4-inch water main on Pine street from Jackson street to Austin street and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property, and fix a time and place for hearing protests against the laying of said water main on said street and the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid.

And whereas, said resolution was duly published and posted as required by section 116 of the charter of said city;

And whereas, a meeting of the council was held at the time and place fixed by said resolution, for the purpose of considering any such protests, but no protests were at said time, or at any other time made to or received by the council to the said laying of the water main, or the assessment of the cost as aforesaid, and said council having considered the matter, and deeming that said water main was and is of material benefit to said city, and that all property to be assessed therefor would be benefited thereby to the extent of the probable amount of the respective assessments to be levied against said property did order said main laid.

And whereas, the cost of said water main has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$1800.91.

Now therefore, it is hereby further determined that the proportionate share of the cost of laying said water main of each parcel of property fronting on said portion of said street is the amount set opposite the description of each parcel of land below, and that each piece or parcel of land benefited by the laying of said water main to the full extent of the amount set opposite the description of the same, and that the respective amounts represent the proportionate benefits of said water main to said respective parcels of land, and also the proportionate frontage thereof on said street, and the council does hereby declare each of the said parcels of property described below to be assessed an amount of the same hereby is assessed the amount set opposite each description for the cost of laying said water main.

Section 3. It is further ordered that the notice above provided for be published three times in the Daily Mail Tribune, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, in the manner provided by ordinance No. 250 of said city.
