

INITIATIVE IS NAMED MENACE

With This In Force In California Laws Against Japanese Could Be Enforced Regardless of Federal Government.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Jan. 27.—All the power of the federal government could not stop California from passing laws against the Japanese and Chinese residents of the state under the proposed initiative, referendum and recall, according to a prominent member of the legislature today. With the passage of the proposed amendments, proposals to restrict Japanese ownership of land, Japanese labor and prescribe the living conditions of the Japanese in California could be brought before the people, he asserted.

"The situation would be serious and fraught with menace," said the lawmaker, who is a member of the senate committee on federal relations, before which the anti-alien bills are pending. "The laboring men, truck farmers and small storekeepers, the scores of house servants whose livelihood is threatened by the Asiatic 'peril' without effort could muster the 5 per cent vote required to bring the restrictive measures before the people."

"After the laws are proposed only a majority vote is required to pass them. The government would be powerless to interfere, save by force. And in the meantime laws could be passed that might be construed as a serious affront to Japan and other far eastern countries."
