

TO RESUME WORK ALAMEDA MINE

Road is Being Constructed at Cost of \$30,000—Auto Trucks Will Be Used to Transport Supplies—Start Work April 1.

GRANTS PASS, Feb. 4.—O. M. Crouch, the general manager of the Alameda mine, was in the city the first of last week and announced that it was the intention to blow in the Alameda smelter about the first of next April. The road from the mine to Leland is nearly completed, and as soon as the weather settles down work will again commence on the road. This road will make a big difference in the transportation of supplies to the Galice district as it will not be necessary to cross the river and will make the distance from the mine to the railroad only fifteen miles. At the present time all the supplies have to come from Merlin and cross the river on the ferry. The road will cost in the neighborhood of \$30,000, but it will be a good road with not more than a six per cent anywhere along the line. It is the intention of his company to put in auto trucks, and it is expected that the trucks will make two and three trips a day and haul much more than can be hauled by team, thereby cutting down the cost of transportation, and his company will do transportation for other people in the Galice district.

Mr. Crouch considers that there is a great future for Josephine county in the mining field and that soon capital will be flowing into the mining section and good stable mines be developed.

PAILSEY MAN TO CAN J. RABBITS

George Conn Has Plan to Save Alfalfa and to Make Much Wealth Beside Rabbits are Proving to Numerous for Comfort.

LAKEVIEW, Ore., Jan. 4.—George Conn, the well known merchant of Paisley, Lake county, is going to conserve the large number of rabbits that have made his large 900-acre ranch above the town their breeding and loafing place. Mr. Conn believes that he has the fattest animals on the continent, as he has turned over to them a large field of alfalfa that he has not needed this year. Having the rabbits in this happy and healthy condition, Mr. Conn is going to erect a large cannery as soon as the railroad is within shipping distance and will pack the choicest morsels, using all the by-products, such as hair, casings, tallow, pelts, etc. He believes that this is a project that will reach wonderful proportions is handled properly, and the animals are grown on the ranch for profit. The cannery will be run from power furnished by the Chewaucan river, the largest stream in the country, and is expected to give employment to hundreds of men and women.
