

ROGUE INDIAN FIGHTER DEAD

Jacob Thompson of Ashland Who Took Part in Early Indian Wars in Southern Oregon, Crosses the Last Divide.

Jacob Thompson is the latest one of the pioneer citizens of Ashland and Jackson County to cross the great divide. He died at his home Sunday night in the 84th year of his age. Only a little more than two months ago his wife died at an age almost as advanced. Mr. Thompson came across the plains to Oregon in 1847, went to the California gold mine in '49, and, returning settled in the Rogue River Valley in 1854. He was engaged in common with many others of the pioneer settlers of that day in defending their homes and families against the attacks of the hostile Indians, and was a member of Captain J. S. Miller's company in the Rogue River Indian War of 1855-6. He operated an extensive stock ranch in Kamath County for many years, returning to Ashland in 1882, where he has since resided. He has been largely interested in property in this city, including business blocks and residence properties. He was a first cousin of the great editor and Ambassador, Whitelaw Reid. He was a member of Ashland Lodge, No. 23, A. F. & A. M., and was at one time president of the Pioneer Society of Southern Oregon. The funeral was held Tuesday afternoon from the Masonic Temple.
