Complaint is Filed by Judge S. S. Peuty—Were Married in 1906—Says He Doesn't Know Where His Wife Is.

### GAS PLANT FOR GRANTS PASS

Council Grants Franchise With Understanding That Work Must Start Within 30 Days—Grants Extends for 50 Years.

GRANTS PASS, Or., Feb. 11.—The city council at a special meeting granted to A. W. Butler of Minneapolis, P. B. Herman and E. L. Church, all of this city a 50-year franchise for a modern and up-to-date gas plant, with a capacity sufficient to supply a population of 30,000. The provisions of the franchise are that work shall be commenced within 90 days and the plant completed within eight months, the company to bear all expense of connections from the mains to the property line. There are the usual restrictions looking to the protection of the city streets and the paved districts. The city will have the option to purchase the plant after 21 years at the actual physical value of the property at that time.

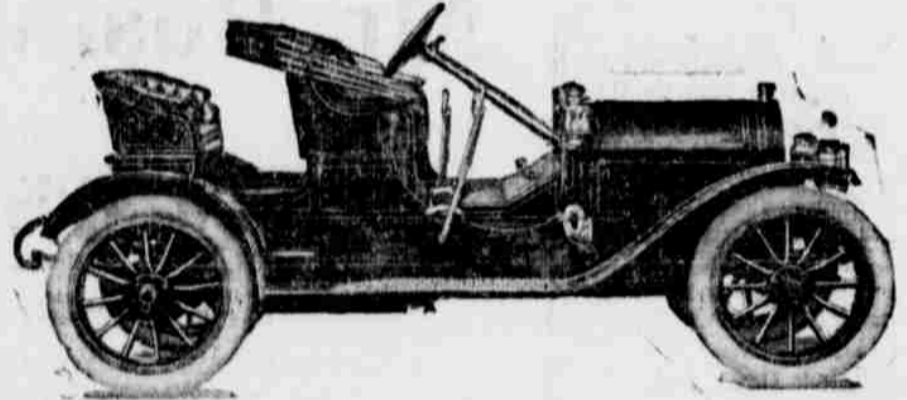

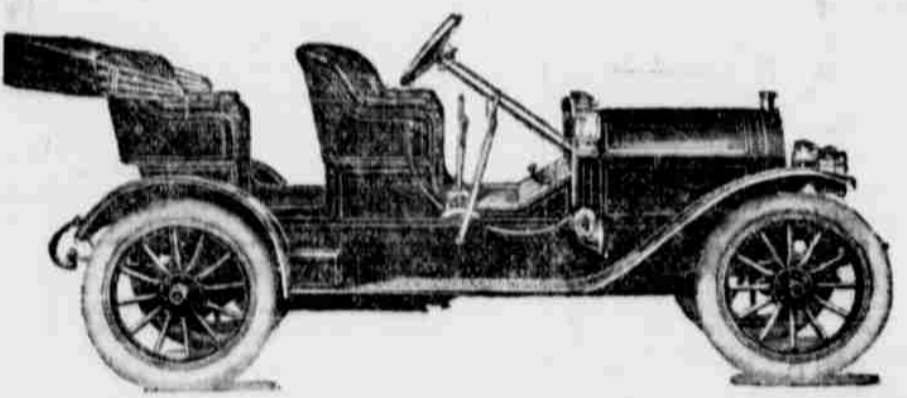

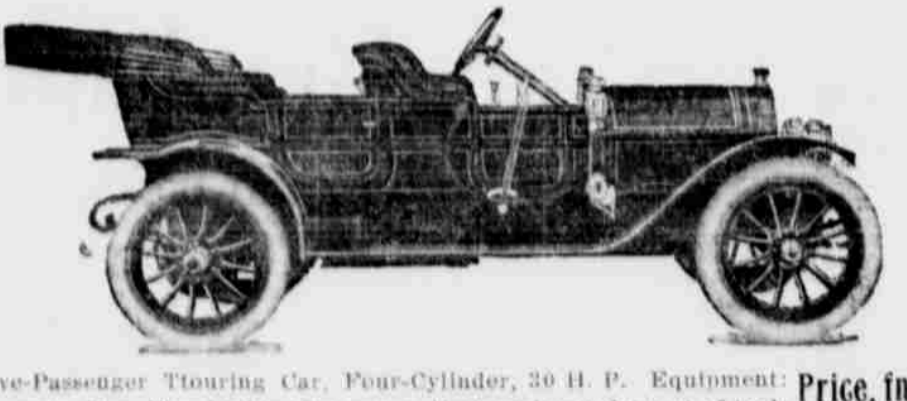
