There shall be appointed by the governor within 30 days after the taking effect of this act, some person to the office of state immigration agent who shall hold said office for compensation.

Upon requisition being made by the state immigration agent the secretary of state shall draw quarterly warrants upon the state treasurer in favor of the respective league or department necessarily expending funds for the work done by it. The state immigration agent shall not be accountable for 20 acres, 4 miles out; good house, any money for which he may issue requisition regularly under this act. and turn over to said Oregon Development League or said Department of Commerce, but he shall take receipt for and require vouchers to 50 acres or more, all cleared, fine be furnished him covering expenditures under the distribution of said funds. The receipts and vouchers are to be filed by him with the secretary of state with his annual report.
