

REALTY MEN TO CURB 'CURB' MEN

Newly Formed Association Goes After Free Lance Broker—Must Belong to Get a "Cut"—Death Knell of "Middleman" is Sounded.

After a lengthy discussion held in the rooms of the Commercial club Thursday night the members of the newly formed real estate exchange voted to adopt a uniform percentage of 5 per cent. Some speakers mentioned extenuating circumstances when more should be charged, but it was finally put to a vote and the 5 per cent commission stood.

Another feature which provoked much discussion was the fixing of the initiation fees of regular and associate members. It was finally decided to charge one member of each firm an initiation fee of \$25 to apply upon a regular membership carrying with it one vote. Only one member of each firm may be a regular member, but all others to whom a commission is paid on a real estate deal must hold an associate membership in the exchange. The fee for this kind of membership was placed at \$10. Dues in both cases were set at \$2 per month, payable quarterly.

The charging of associate members \$10 and requiring firms employing curbstone men and paying commissions to any person bringing them a customer, eliminates the free lances. The provision is a strict one and, according to the attitude of the members present last night, is to be pressed to the fullest extent.
