

APPLE PRICES IN NEW YORK

Barrelled Product in Greater Demand Than Boxed Fruit—Newtowns and Spitzenburg at \$2.25 Per Box in Metropolis.

NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—Improved outside demand for apples strengthened the market this week, made holders jubilant, and stiffened prices for fancy marks. The supply of really desirable stock was light, while that of choice to moderate kinds was sufficient for trade requirements. Although markets in other cities were reported strong and active, the demand from interpoints showed a very big improvement, and the movement was brisker than for some time. "Barrelled apples went in all directions," said a well-known receiver, "and everybody seemed to want them. It was the United States. It is believed that apples would improve in sympathy with the other kinds, but there was no change in those varieties and the market closed about firm."

Baldwins, when strictly fancy brought \$5.25 to \$5.50, but most of the receipts sold for prices ranging from \$3.75 to \$4.75 per barrel. Greenings were in moderate supply and sold at prices ranging from \$ to \$5.50. Extra fancy kinds commanded \$6. The supply, however, was very limited. The supply of box apples exceeded the demand, and prices ruled as follows: Hood River, Newtown Pippin, per box, \$1.50 to \$2.25; California, Newtown Pippin, \$1.60 to \$1.75; far western, Spitzenburg, \$1.70 to \$2.25; Black Twig, \$1.75 to \$2.25; Roman Beauty, \$1.75 to \$2.25; Pearmain, \$1.50 to \$1.75; Oregon Red, \$1.50 to \$2.25; Ben Davis, \$1.60 to \$1.80; Gano, \$1.60 to \$1.90; Wine sap, \$2.00 to \$2.50.
