

MANY CHAMPION CURB MERCHANTS

Petition, Signed by Many, Asking That Ice Cream and Pop Corn Merchants Be Allowed to Continue in Business is Filed.

Following close on the heels of a petition signed by a majority of the downtown business men, presented at the last meeting of the city council asking that body to take steps to remove from the public streets the peanut, ice cream, hot hamburger wagons, another petition, signed by a greater number of people than the first, asking that the "ice cream and pop corn" wagons be allowed to continue in business as heretofore was filed in the office of City Recorder Robert W. Telfer this morning.

The more recent petition, although signed by a greater number of persons than the first, does not represent in a single instance any person in front of whose property the wagons conduct their business, and the persons who had charge of securing the signatures contented themselves with signers from the residential district. Inasmuch as the men who pay taxes and rentals on downtown properties have objected to the competition and presence in front of their places of business of the curbside merchants, it is not believed that the petition filed Friday will have very much weight in influencing the members of the street committee of the council, who at present have the matter under advisement.
