

# \$1,000,000 LOSS SO. CALIFORNIA

Santa Inez River Near Santa Barbara, Reaches Highest Point in Years—Southern Pacific Discontinues Service South.

SANTA BARBARA, Cal., March 9.—Following the heaviest storm of recent years, the Santa Inez river reached the highest mark in the memory of the oldest inhabitants at 8 o'clock today and was still rising. Rain, which temporarily ceased, began falling again at midnight and continued steadily throughout the day, swelling Mission creek until it went on a wild rampage through the streets in the lower sections of the city. At noon three inches had fallen, making 33 for the season.

The Southern Pacific has discontinued service south. The line north of here has been out for three days. Bridges are out and roads are impassable except on horseback. Reports from surrounding sections indicated that distress already was being felt in many sections. Unless the rain abates before night, it was predicted the damage from floods in Ventura county will be more than a year's.

## PAYS TWO YEARS FOR 90 MINUTES' FREEDOM

LEAVENWORTH, Kan., March 8.—For an hour and 30 minutes of freedom, E. A. Lowery, a convict of the United States military prison here, must pay two years of his life. Lowery, disguising himself in the clothing of a teamster late yesterday escaped from the prison, but 90 minutes later he was recaptured.

He was returned to his cell and in addition to 35 days of a two years' sentence which he had yet to serve, he must pay for his vacation this afternoon with two years more, that being the penalty for attempting to escape.

## HAWLEY TO REMAIN AT NATIONAL CAPITAL

WASHINGTON, March 9.—Representative Hawley, who was recently appointed a member of the Appalachian and White Mountain forest reserve commission, attended the first meeting yesterday with Senators Gallinger and Smith, Representative Lee of Georgia and Secretaries Wilson, Ballinger and Dickinson.

Hawley probably will not take a vacation, but will remain here to dispose of accumulated business.

Senator Bourne today will address the legislature of Delaware on the Oregon laws.

## Idaho Troops Move.

BOISE, Idaho, March 9.—Three troops of the First cavalry, comprising 164 men, 12 officers and band, together with camp equipment, will leave Boise early tomorrow for the southern border.

They will be transported in a special train of 26 cars to San Bernardino, where the troops which transferred to the Southern Pacific and will be rushed on to Fort Huachuca, Ariz., there to await orders from General Schuler of the department of Colorado.
