TABLE WINES HAVE ADVANCED IN PRICE

PARIS, March 8.—Since December of 1910 the prices of ordinary "table wines" have advanced 20 to 25 per cent. This was done by a sort of "wine trust" movement, the merchants all over the country, by common accord, agreeing to boost on account of the bad year, Barrels of Bordeaux which last year bid for 250 francs now sell for 300 and bottled wine which cost one franc now sells for 1 1/4 francs.

The year of 1910 was one of the worst in the history of France. Other years which were disastrous were those of 1879, 1886, 1887, 1889, 1890 and 1895 when the average production was from 24,000,000 to 25,000,000 barrels of wine of 22 gallons each.
