CAN'T SELL FISH OF ROGUE RIVER

Attorney General Furnishes Master Fish Warden With Opinion in Matter of Selling Salmon Taken in the Waters of Local Stream.

That no variety of fish, steelhead trout or salmon, taken in the waters of Rogue River will now be lawfully sold is the opinion of the Attorney General, who sets forth his views in the following letter to the master fish warden, which is self explanatory:

Salem, March 9, 1911, Mr. R. E. Clanton, master fish warden, Capitol building. Dear Sir: I have your favor of the 7th instant, enclosing copy of House Bill No. 184, enacted by the recent session of the legislature, together with copy of the Rogue river fishing laws, enacted at the last election, and asking my opinion thereon, whether, after said House Bill becomes effective, it will be lawful to sell salmon, other than steelheads, taken from Rogue River with a hook and line.

I would answer your question in the negative for the reason that said initiative act makes a continual closed season on said river by any means, except with hook and line. Section 1 of said House Bill 184 makes it unlawful at any time to sell steelheads or trout. Section 2 makes it unlawful during any closed season to sell salmon, other than steelheads, and there being a continual closed season, it is, therefore, unlawful to sell such salmon, other than steelheads, at any time, although it is lawful to take them with hook and line.

The evident intention of the legislature in passing House Bill 184 was to allow salmon, other than steelheads, to be sold whenever there is an open season, but the bill providing for open and closed seasons having been vetoed by the governor, leaving the initiative act providing a continual closed season in force, there is no open season, and, therefore, such salmon cannot be sold for want of an open season.
