REAL BUG, NOT FIRE BUG, SPREAD FIRE

California Forester Says Bark Beetle Bug is Responsible for Spreading of Forest Fires Throughout Local Forests.

State Forester Homans, of California, is endeavoring to combat the ravages of the bark beetle, which infects lodge-pole and yellow pine trees and is actually believed to be largely responsible for the spread of many of the most devastating fires in the great pine forest of the Northwest.

The bark beetle, in passing from the bark to the heart of the tree, causes the pitch to form in what is known as "pitch tubes," or warts, on the outside of the tree.
