GREAT INTEREST IN COAST ROAD

Eureka Speculates Now as to the Time When Railroad Will Connect That Place With Crescent City—Much Activity is Expected.

EUREKA, Cal., March 22.—Great interest has been manifested in this city with reference to the news that the Grants Pass and Rogue River railroad is now building out of Grants Pass west toward Crescent City in Del Norte county, 100 miles north of Eureka.

Much speculation has arisen as to when a line will be constructed to connect Eureka with Crescent City, and the consensus of opinion seems to be that if the Grants Pass-Crescent City road is built within the next year and a half, it will not be long thereafter before the coast line will be in operation.

There is now every indication that the road will be pushed on to Crescent City as fast as men and money can build it. There is a big timber and mineral belt at the western terminus of the proposed line and a big market in the east for the products to be taken out.

That there will ultimately be a coast line from this city north to Portland is taken for granted generally. The only thing that is uncertain is the date.

CARNEGIE'S FAME EFFORTS.

ANDREW CARNEGIE'S efforts to buy the good will of posterity and the respect of future generations by giving millions to libraries and to peace funds are absurd. They indicate the uneasy conscience.

Mr. Carnegie's money comes from exploiting his fellow men. It is the toll taken from the labor of the many through the manipulation of government for the benefit of the few.

Mr. Carnegie has said that it is a disgrace for a man to die rich. It is then far more of a disgrace to accumulate useless riches during life at the expense of humanity.

If Mr. Carnegie desires so to benefit humanity, why does he not begin with his army of employes, better their life, with its unnatural confinement, its repression, strain and tension, its heart-breaking monotony, its emptiness and disappointment?

Dinky little libraries in Medford and other towns, maintained at public expense to keep green the name of Carnegie will but point a moral to adorn a tale.

Posterity judges a man by what he has done for humanity. This alone lives, the balance is forgotten.

It seems probable that in the future estimate of history it will not be Mr. Carnegie's gifts either of libraries or of peace funds or of scientific resources, however successful these may be, which will be hailed as his great contribution to the race; but rather his part in making steel fine and cheap, to be the tool of every craft of civilization, the framework of its shelter and the means of its communication.

PLANNING A CITY.

A CITY should be planned just as well as a home. Topographic features, parks, shade trees should be considered.

Beauty is as important an element in the creation of the city as utility.

While Medford is still in the transition stage of emerging from the country village to the small city, the idea of the city beautiful should ever be kept in mind.

Some of the additions to Medford laid out by greedy real estate speculators not only neglect beauty, but also utility. They provide lots to sell only, without regard to the welfare or convenience of the residents or the future growth and necessities of the city.

The plots for these additions should never have been accepted by the county. All should have been referred to the city engineer for rejection.

Ashland is setting all the cities of Oregon a worthy example in actually becoming the city beautiful. It has a park system worthy of the name.

Medford, lacking these natural advantages, must make up by increased energy. If streets are not wide enough for parks in the center, the curbs can be parked.

It will soon be too late to plant trees—now is the time. Don't let the opportunity slip. Do your share.

TECARTE TROOPS STILL FIGHTING

NO MEMBER OF GAME BOARD

Southern Oregon the Goat, Thanks to Eastern Oregon's Hoggishness in Wanting Two Members When Only Entitled to One.

That southern Oregon will not secure membership on the new fish and game commission is one of the bits of unwelcome information imparted by Governor West during his recent visit.

"The amendment passed making two of the members from eastern Oregon, has cut out southern Oregon, I am afraid," stated Governor West.

"The Columbia river salmon interests are entitled to one member. The coast salmon interests to another. The game interests of western and northern Oregon centering at Portland, are entitled to a third.

However, with the master fish warden from southern Oregon, and the governor himself helping out the Rogue river, southern Oregon ought to be well looked after.

Probably the commission will consist of members from Astoria, Klammath Falls, Portland, Pendleton and one that the members themselves will select.
