SALEM, Or., March 25 .- As intimated at the time by the attorney general to the members of the executive committee of the state grange who visited him at his office Saturday afternoon, Mr. Crawford holds in a written opinion that the several counties have no authority to call special elections for the purpose of creationg a debt for the building of permanent roads, or for any purpose excepting in certain cases specifically provided for as for the purpose of submitting the question of the creation and maintenance of county high schools or for prohibiting the sale of liquor under the local option law.




