It is said there are nearly 300 acres of placer gold bearing ground on this place, and Mr. Ogden and associates intend to develop this mine. The purchase price was \$36,000. Considering the probable richness of this placer ground, this is probably the lowest price paid in recent years for land of like character in the Rogue River valley, as the property, without the mine, is well worth the money.

would undoubtedly be as successful as ever today had not President Taft made his memorial trip to the Philippines in 1905. Mr. McIntosh was the "official photographer." With the aid of two skilled assistants, he returned with more than 2000 valuable negatives. This led to his successful lecture, "With Taft in the Orient."
