"MORE WORK FOR THE VOTER."

THE Portland Oregonian is constantly commiserating the Oregon voter because he is called upon to decide new political questions. Each election sees more problems submitted for popular decision, and the "voters burdens grow more rather than less."

They should. Herein lies the chief value of the "Oregon system." It teaches people to think on public questions. By increasing the duties of citizenship it makes better citizens.

If voters are incapable of passing judgment upon issues, then popular government is a failure, and its theory is wrong. Of they are capable, then the more problems submitted, the better.

Citizenship entails certain responsibilities. It is the province of democracy to increase these responsibilities, not to lighten them. The failures of democracy are due to the shifting of these responsibilities, from the many and their seizure by the few.

"Let us do your work for you" has ever been the cry of the politician, the partisan, and the grafter. But no one can do the peoples work for them, except the people themselves and the Oregon system in a step in the evolution of the citizen, to teach him how to live up to his responsibilities.

Nothing worth while in this world is secured without effort and labor, least of all popular government. It is good or bad as we ourselves make it by attention or neglect of the duties of citizenship. Hence if we expect good government, we must first have good citizenship.
