

## JUDGE CALKINS PASSES SENTENCE

Two Are Taken to Salem Where They Will Serve Indeterminate Sentences—Mrs. Griffiths is Granted Divorce—Desertion Grounds.

Judge Calkins sentenced J. W. Canon, E. A. Nering and W. E. Davies Saturday morning, and two of them, Canon and Davies, were taken to Salem by Charles Gay and Louis Warner to serve out their sentences in the penitentiary.

J. W. Canon, convicted of robbery, was given a sentence of from one to 10 years, the length of which is to be determined by good behavior. If a clean record is shown only one year will be served.

W. E. Davies was given a similar sentence which is based on the same provision.

E. A. Nering was given a sentence of six months in the county jail and sentence suspended on good behavior.

The divorce case of Lora Griffith against Lincoln Griffith was called Saturday afternoon and a judgment by default given Mrs. Griffith.

On January 24, 1910, Griffith deserted his wife and daughter Alma age 12. A son, Ray, age 15, was cared for by Mr. Griffith. Since that time, Mrs. Griffith has supported herself and child by manual labor. She asked the custody of the girl and \$10 per month alimony.

## 1000 PEOPLE IN BUTTE FALLS 1913

Such is Prediction of Resident of That City—Lumber Company Will Start Operations Monday — Millwright Now at Work.

"Work is booming in Butte Falls" said a prominent citizen of that city Saturday "and we expect to be 1000 people in 1913.

"The Butte Falls Lumber company will commence operations on Monday, a mill right from Portland has been placing new machinery and all will be in readiness then for the summer work.

Forty acres of timber have been felled on the school house flat, three miles this side of Butte Falls. They will cut it up with gasoline saws for fire wood.

"Surveyors are locating a spur to the mill. The distance is a little over 5000 feet and the grade a 3 per cent cut work will take the place of trestles and a switch back used.

There is considerable building at Butte Falls. Three new stores are going up and business is lively.

"The lumber for the new depot is on the ground and work will commence on it about April 5th.

"The Butte Falls mill is building a reservoir on the hill above the mill for fire protection. It will hold 15,000 gallons of water.

## HILLMAN GETS LONG SENTENCE

Seattle Real Estate Man Who Was Convicted of Fraud is Given Long Jail Sentence and Large Fine—Judge Roasts Him.

SEATTLE, Wash., April 1.—C. D. Hillman, millionaire real estate oper-

ator and builder of boom towns, was sentenced to two years and six months in the federal penitentiary and to pay a fine of \$5200 by United States District Judge Donworth today. Donworth refused this morning to grant a new trial to the real estate man convicted of using the mails to defraud. Then he refused to stay the sentence asked for. After that he pronounced sentence. He scored the prisoner severely as he sentenced him.

Judge Donworth sentenced Hillman to two years and six months on each of the 13 counts on which he was found guilty. However, he pro-

vided that he might serve all the sentences at the same time, so that the real estate man need serve only two years and a half altogether. District Attorney Todd announces that he will ask \$200,000 bail for Hillman pending his probable appeal to the United States circuit court of appeals.
