A modern 40 horse power automohile is to replace the old stage coach which has traveled through the Siskiyous from Ager to Klamath Springs daily for 25 years,

The Klamath Hot Springs stagefine has been one of the state's institutions. Originally the road between the railroad and the springs. 22 miles up Klamath river, where the celebrated Shovel creek flows in. was part of the overland stage route between San Francisco and Portland.
