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AUTO REPLACES OLD STAGE COACH

Venerable Vehicle That Has Traveled Siskiyou For Over 25 Years is Taken From Run and Auto Put on—Great Help.

A modern 40 horse power automobile is to replace the old stage coach which has traveled through the Siskiyou from Ager to Klamath Springs daily for 25 years.

The Klamath Hot Springs stage-line has been one of the state's institutions. Originally the road between the railroad and the springs, 22 miles up Klamath river, where the celebrated Shovel creek flows in, was part of the overland stage route between San Francisco and Portland.

Beyond all doubt more large rainbow trout have been caught in Shovel creek and in the river near where the creek flows in than at any other point in the whole west.

Thus the stage line remained one of importance after overland stage days were ended forever. The noted drivers remaining sought the privilege of driving the Klamath Hot Springs, of conveying the passengers and handling the mail.

THE SEER'S LATEST WARNING.

A FEW days since ex-President Roosevelt issued a warning against forcing children to learn Bible verses, lest it make the Bible obnoxious to them.

The warning from the knowing one is uncalled for. Few children nowadays, or grown people either, know much about the Bible.

We know all too little of the Bible, of its wonderful poetic imagery, its stately phraseology, its simplicity of style and its classic beauty.

If one-tenth the time expended upon literature were expended upon study of the Bible as the climax of art in literature (irregardless of moral effect), how much sweeter and purer English as she is spoken, would be! We can dispense with the bulk of our libraries, but we cannot dispense with the Bible, any more than we can with Shakespeare—and all know far too little about both.

A MATTER OF REGRET.

RETIREMENT of John F. Stevens from control of the Hill lines in Oregon is universally regretted—nowhere more than in southern Oregon.

In the short space of twenty months Mr. Stevens changed the railroad map of Oregon. He did more to develop the state than the Harriman lines had accomplished in twenty years.

Mr. Stevens saw the wonderful possibilities that awaited the coming of transportation, the era of progress and development thereby made possible.

Mr. Stevens saw the future that awaits Medford and the Rogue River valley, and made this city the southwestern terminus of his projected railroad system.

Mr. Stevens has spent over \$15,000,000 in Oregon of money, and the completion of the program he has prepared will entail the additional expenditure of \$30,000,000.

THE NEW BANKING TRUST.

THE recent purchase of the New York Bank of Commerce, with \$25,000,000 capital, by the Standard Oil interests calls attention to the consolidation of banking interests in the hands of a few.

"When the money power in New York is so massed in a few hands that there will not remain one single old-fashioned banker so impolite as not to sneeze when Mr. Baker or Mr. Stillman takes snuff, we may be quite ready for Mr. Aldrich's central bank—unless the masters of the people's money decide that they no longer have any need for such an institution."

"It means that if the Aldrich plan be adopted, the issuance and control of all the money in this country will be permanently in the hands of the few men who now rule Wall street."

"The control of the money by these men will give them the power to control all the credit upon which business is transacted—not only big credit, but little credit as well. Not only will it affect great railroads and steel and iron works, but every small merchant who finds it necessary to offer his note to a bank with even the soundest collateral."
