

SEEK GUARD FOR MADERO

President Diaz Asked to Protect Provisional President of Mexico During Peace Conference—Request is Made By Father.

EL PASO, Texas, April 5.—The father of Provisional President Madero today sought to secure from President Diaz a guarantee that federal troops will safeguard his son if the latter comes here informally to discuss peace terms with representatives of the Mexican president. If peace is brought in Mexico it probably will be the result of conferences soon to be held in El Paso.

It was learned from a source of worthiness that insurgent agents have approached American officials to secure evidence of a conspiracy war-raid which will allow Madero to come to El Paso without of arrest. If the department of justice consents it is believed that Madero will leave at once from Chihuahua for El Paso.

The trunk sewer line in district 3 was ordered laid and all excavating and filling in to be done by the company, the pipe to be 10-inch. Manholes to cost \$55. A peculiar situation was revealed by the passing of this ordinance. The work had been done and paid for before the act authorizing the work had been passed. The resolution to pave East Main street was passed.

An ordinance ordering a cement walk, five feet wide on North Peach street between West Main and West Fourth was passed.

An 8-inch sewer was ordered on Beatty street between North Central and Manzanita street.

A six inch sewer on West Palm starting 40 feet east of Oakdale and running 510 feet in a westerly direction.

An 8-inch sewer was ordered placed in the alley between Plum and Benson streets from Dakota to Washington.

An 8-inch sewer was ordered on Eleventh street from Peach to Plum.

A 6-inch sewer to run through block 4 from Liberty to Alice streets.

A 6-inch sewer to run through block 3, from Liberty and Manzanita streets.

A 6-inch sewer through blocks 2 and 5 from Alice to Manzanita.

An 8-inch sewer on Manzanita from Beatty to Riverside.

A resolution for a 6-inch water main on Wallumette avenue from East Main to South Anne streets was passed.

A resolution for a 6-inch water main on East Eleventh from Williams to Portland avenue was passed.

Resolution for a 4-inch water main to go down the alley between Plum and Benson streets from Washington to Dakota avenue passed.

A resolution for a 4-inch water main on Taylor street from Collier to the east end of the street passed.

A resolution for a 4-inch water main on Eleventh street from Peach to Plum was passed.

A resolution for a 4-inch water main on Niantic street from Alice to Manzanita streets was passed.

A resolution for a 4-inch water main on Alice street from Beatty to Niantic street was approved.

A resolution for a 4-inch water main on South Peach from Dakota avenue to the city limits on the south was passed.

The lot offered by the Southern Pacific for park purposes for \$200 was rejected.

Captain Badger, U. S. N., to be a rear admiral.

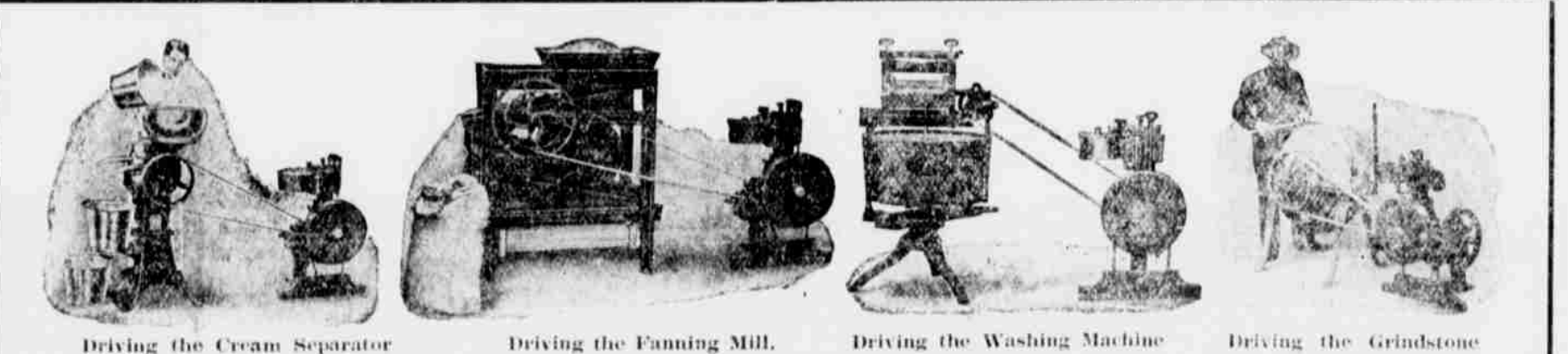

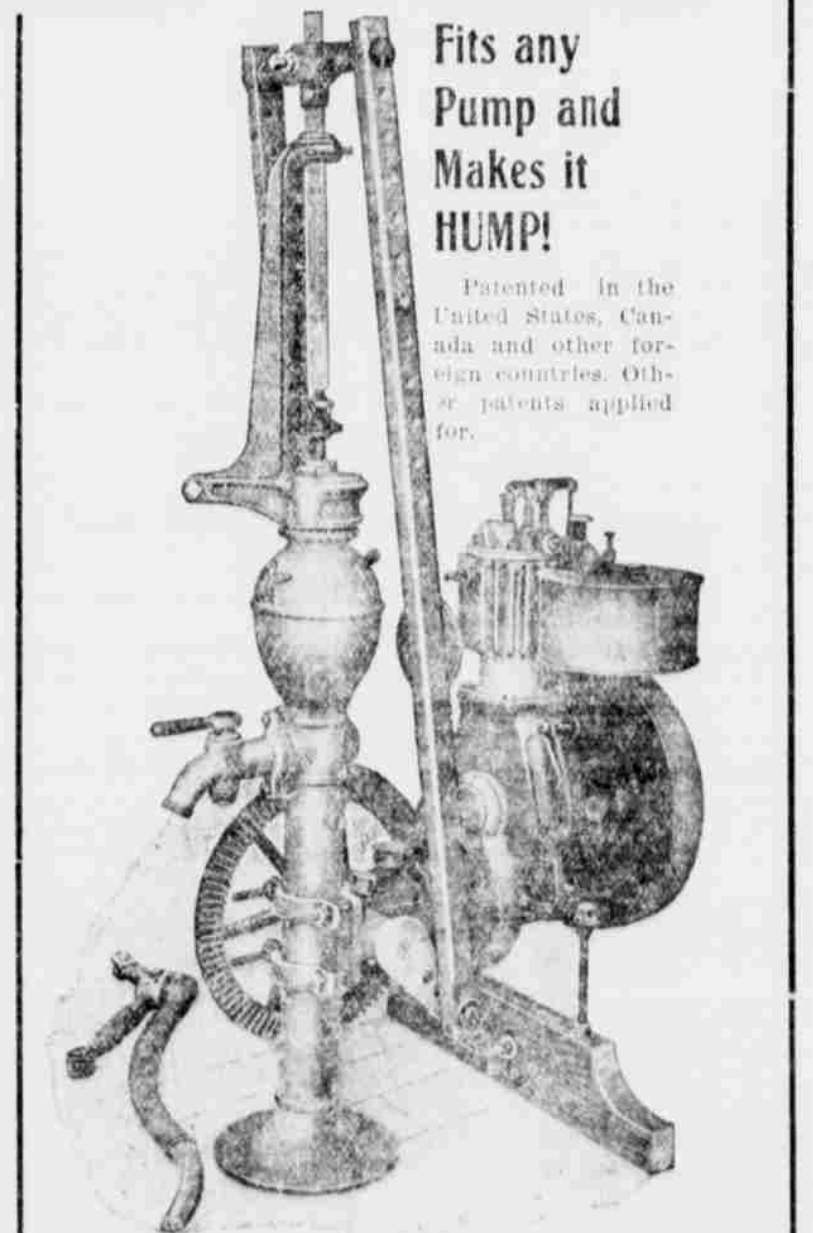
