> PARIS, April 13.-With the coming of dawn the burning of wineries and the pillaging of villages in the department of Marne by winegrowers, who are enraged at the action of the senate on the champagne labeling question, was renewed.

> At Venteuil the growers have barricaded the town against troops and the wineries are being sacked and burned.

> Two thousand growers are reported marching against Rheims. All wires running out of the city have been cut and it is impossible to learn the exact situation there.

> In an effort to check the work of the vandals the government has rushed 13,000 troops to Epernay and neighboring towns. The villagers are meeting the charges of cavalry and infantry with dynamite bombs and bottles of rare vintages.

> Troops have been ordered to shoot any one caught setting fire to the wineries or looting, tI was announced today that the governmentwould send 50,000 troops to quell the disorder if necessary.
