

CAPTAIN SEARS IS INDICTED

Coroner's Jury Charges Commander of Iroquois With Manslaughter—Warrant for His Arrest Issued Before Investigation Was Completed.

VICTORIA, B. C., April 18.—Charged with manslaughter by the coroner's jury which investigated the foundering last week of the Steamer Iroquois, Capt. A. A. Sears will be arraigned tomorrow to plead.

A warrant for Sears' arrest was issued before the coroner's jury completed its work, when the evidence was given to the effect that Sears deserted his ship while passengers were aboard and that he did not make proper effort to rescue those struggling in the current. Sears with four members of the crew, was the first to reach shore after the vessel had gone down.

Investigating Graft In the State of New York

OSBORNE, N. Y., April 19.—Political favoritism and petty grafting have cost the state thousands of dollars in the last decade in the administration of the Sing Sing State Prison, according to the testimony under oath of a half score witnesses this city. The testimony was offered at the first public hearing conducted by William Church Osborn and George E. Van Kennen, Special Commis-

sioners named by Governor Dix to investigate charges of corruption and mismanagement of state institutions. Two prominent republican politicians of Northern New York—John E. O'Brien, one time secretary of state, and George C. Kellog, son of the one time Supreme Court Justice—figured in sensational disclosures in which the state is said to have lost thousands of dollars in the

purchase of fuel for the prison. The fuel is said to have been sold at a figure, which an expert accountant, testified was far above the market price, and a grade of coal inferior to that for which the state had bargained. The name of Theodore Roosevelt's chief lieutenant at the Saratoga Convention, Cornelius V. Collins, of Troy, State Superintendent of Prisons, was mentioned many times during the day's session.

His Candidate is Elected Mayor of Zion City — Independents Today Are Hurling Charges of Fraud and Corruption.

ZION CITY, Ill., April 19.—Charges of fraud, repeating and corruption are made here today by the "Independents" of Zion City following yesterday's election in which Hurd Chendomin, the Voliva candidate, was finally declared to have been elected mayor by a plurality of five votes. The "Independents" declare they will contest the election of practically every official of the Dowdy City. When the ballots were counted it was found that the Voliva faction had elected three of the five councilmen with a plurality of just three votes each.
