

OWNERS OF LAND PREMIUM IS MUST SIGN UP PAID FOR BONDS

Fate of Klamath Project to Depend on Action of Klamath Ranchers— If They Fail to Sign With Uncle Sam They Will Lose.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., April 19.—The fate of the Upper Klamath project now rests with the land owners. Director P. H. Newell, of the Reclamation Service, has sent out communication that it will be necessary for the land owners to sign up their lands for water at the cost of construction. The cost will depend largely on the acreage subscribed, but it is estimated that under favorable conditions it will cost approximately \$50 an acre.

LINN COUNTY FRUIT IS NOT DAMAGED

Experts Examine Orchards and Report That Loss Will Be Very Light—Inspectors Go Over Orchards but Say Crop Not Seriously Hurt.

ALBANY, Ore., April 19.—Inspection reports that the late cold snap has really done no damage to fruit in this section of the Willamette Valley. Immediately after the cold weather it was impossible to measure the extent of the damage to tree fruits and other tender plants. Now, after a lapse of eight or 10 days it is possible to now examine the blossoms on the trees then in full bloom and experts make the statement that the damage was not as severe as first reported and that, if any damage was done, it would in the end prove beneficial on account of the better quality possible where no great an abundance of blossoms do not mature into fruit on the trees.

FISH WARDEN GUARDS STREAM

Appoints 25 Deputies to Stop Fishing in Willamette During Closed Season—Clanton Says Law Will Be Rigidly Enforced at Any Cost.

SALEM, Ore., April 19.—Master Fish Warden Clanton returned from Oregon City yesterday where he had personal charge of matters on the Willamette and Clackamas Rivers at noon on April 15, and deputized 25 additional men and hired a number of launches so that the order of the board of fish commissioners closing these streams until May 1 at noon would be carried out to the letter. This precaution, however, was found to be unnecessary, as at 10 o'clock on the morning of that day the gizzard shiner had a nesting and decided to abide by the board's order, there being only two dissenting votes. The Willamette and Clackamas fisheries are now abiding citizens, and when the matter was thoroughly explained to them were not disposed to violate the order in any manner. The fish warden anticipates no open violation, but will keep a number of the deputies on duty, not only on these streams, but also on the Columbia, to see that no poaching is being carried on before the season opens at noon on May 1. In former years it has been reported that large quantities of salmon were turned into the Columbia and cold storage plants on the opening day of the fishing season, the bulk of which, without a doubt, were taken during the closed season, but 1911 poaching will be stamped out if possible this spring.

MARION COUNTY FRUIT NOT HURT

Cherries Will Yield Good Crop, Says Expert, After Visiting Orchards— Frost Hit Prunes Worse Than Any Other Variety of Fruit.

SALEM, Ore., April 19.—The recent cold weather did no great damage to fruit. Henry Porter, a local fruit man, has made a trip by auto to different sections of the county and examined the fruit trees, and he says that the cherry crop is damaged very little, if any, and there should be a good yield this season, providing no extremely cold rains prevail before harvesting time. The prune crop is damaged to a small extent, especially in the low country, where it is more advanced, while the tall country fruit is not damaged at all.

Special Session Called.

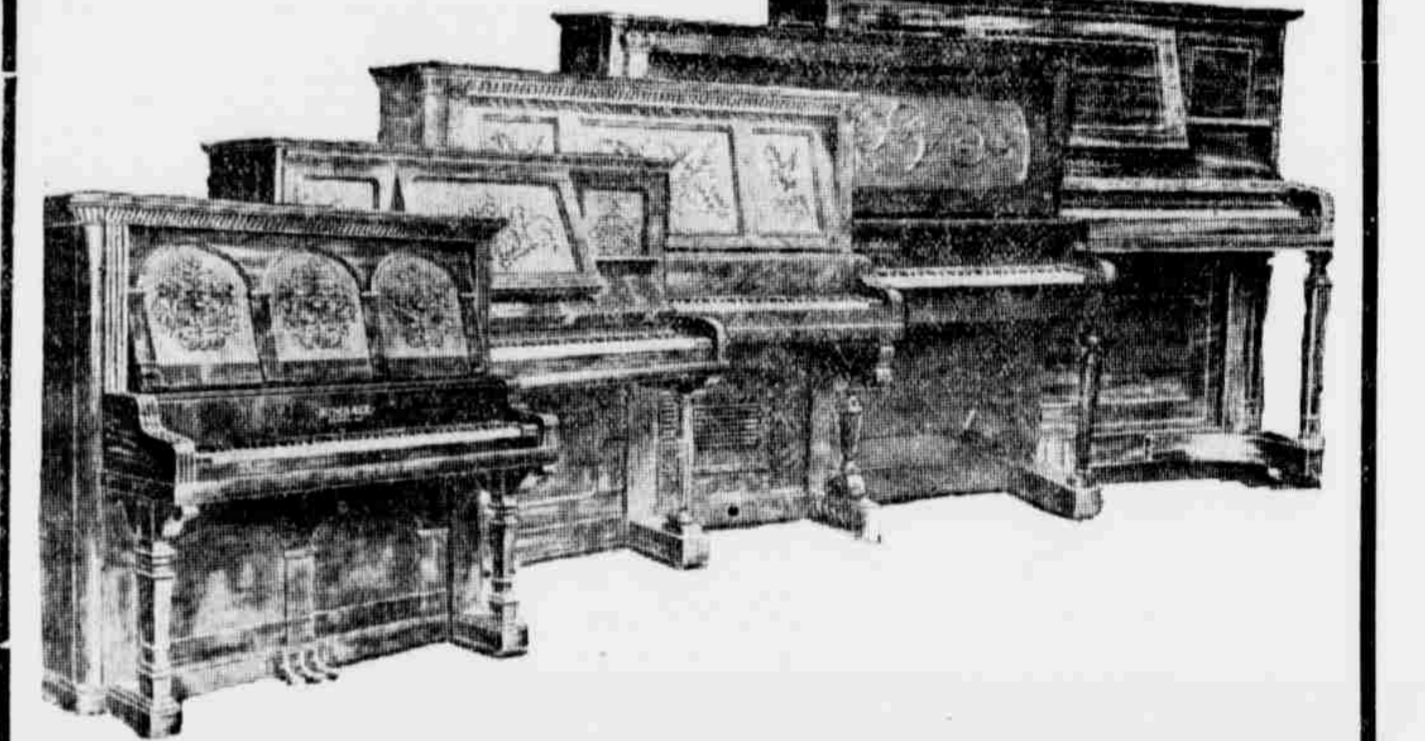
