

## ONLY ENTRANCE TO ALASKA COAL MINES SEIZED

Delegate Wickersham Throws Great Light on Present Situation in Alaska—Syndicate Has Bottled Resources.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 21.—Discussing charges that an executive order signed by President Taft opening to entry certain lands in the Chugach mountain forest will give the Morgan-Guggenheim syndicate an absolute control of the Alaska coal lands as would the patenting of the Cunningham claims, and the LaFollette resolution asking an investigation of the entries under the order, Delegate Jim in Congress Jas. Wickersham of Alaska today gave the following statement to the United Press:

"There are two possible outlets from the Behring river coal fields, wherein the so-called Cunningham group is located. The first, for several months, has been controlled by the Guggenheims. It comprises a 90 mile haul around the coast to Cordova both over a railroad the Guggenheims own. The other is through Controller Bay, reached over lands secured by the same interests over the president's order of October last. If the investigation demanded by the La Follette resolution discloses what is generally believed—that both routes are owned by the Alaska syndicate—that syndicate has been placed in exclusive control of the only railroads and the only harbors over which the coal from this field can reach the markets.

"Such a monopoly would be more valuable than the Cunningham group itself, since it would control the marketing of all coal and fix the rates of transportation and the price to the consumer."

"On October 12, 1910, the president withdrew 12,800 acres of land, commanding an outlet on Controller Bay, from the Chugach forest reserve. This land was immediately claimed by those interested in the Controller Bay railroad. In the last hours of the session, congress, on March 4, passed an act giving the Controller Bay Railroad a right of way through the 12,800 acres to the shores of Controller Bay and the right to locate terminals and a deep water harbor. I believe that the La Follette resolution inquiry will show that the Alaska syndicate secured the ownership to the 12,800 acres thus released from the reservation and a monopoly of the only harbor in Alaska from which its great coal deposits can be shipped."

### Investigates Suicide.

OAKLAND, Cal., April 21.—The coroner will hold an inquest today into the suicide of H. G. Brown, a former saloon owner of Spokane, who shot himself Monday in City Hall park. Notes left behind indicate that Brown killed himself so that his wife might get his insurance money.

The new club, instituted by Mr. Edwards, is a credit in every way to the city. Over \$1500 has been expended for equipment and the place has been fitted up in the most modern manner. In the "gym" are found rowing machines, weights, trap eze, ladders, punching bags, boxing gloves, dumb bells, Indian clubs, horses, horizontal bars, medicine balls—in fact every device known to the physical culture art. In the basement is a system of lockers, three shower baths, rubbing rooms and the like. In the library are found the late periodicals while in the library itself are found standard works, including the famed "Harvard Classics" of Dr. Elliott.

The institution will in a great degree take the place of a Y. M. C. A. in the city. Physical culture classes will be organized and the institution kept up to a high standard. Mr. Edwards is to be congratulated in giving Medford such a club on such a standard.

## TO ANNIHILATE PINE BEETLE

State Board of Forestry Will Soon Begin a Campaign of Extermination Against Bug Which is Damaging State Forests.

SALEM, Ore., April 21.—Co-operating with the government, the state board of forestry will soon begin a campaign for the annihilation of the Mountain and Western pine beetle which are killing large areas of trees in eastern and southern Oregon. It is understood that the government will co-operate with the forestry boards of Washington, Idaho, Montana and of California with the same object in view.

State forester Elliott commenting on the matter today said that the work of extermination would begin immediately after a deputy forester was appointed by the board which meets next Tuesday.


