

RECIPROCITY WILL AID FRUIT GROWER

Western Washington Orchardists Are Told Canadian Market Is Just What They Need to Stimulate Industry, as It Will Create Demand.

TACOMA, Wash., April 24.—While Congressman La Follette, militant insurgent, whose district embraces the large wheatgrowing section of eastern Washington, is steadfastly opposing the ratification of the Canadian reciprocity treaty, State Senator W. H. Paulhamus of Pierce county, no less insurgent in his politics, is leading the fruitgrowers of western Washington in a fight for the extension of the market for their produce, which he believes will follow the breaking down of the tariff wall.

"From a fruit standpoint," says Senator Paulhamus, "the state of Washington is blind on two sides. On the west we have the Pacific ocean, on the north we have the Canadian barrier. This leaves us but two directions in which to find markets. On the south we have Oregon and California, both of which are also fruit specialists. The state of Washington is a good market for all the fruit grown south of us, because it ripens earlier than our own. Owing to the Canadian tariff, we do not have a market to the north of us, as our neighbors on the south do.

"To my mind, the fruit industry will soon be the chief industry of this state. If this be true, we should endeavor to open up the greatest possible opportunities to market our products. It must be plain to everyone that the best market we could possibly have is in the country to the north of us, in which the ripening season is correspondingly later than our own is later than California. If it is necessary to pay 11 cents duty per box on peaches, 30 cents on apples and 50 cents on berries, we can readily understand that consumption will be curtailed, but if this tariff is removed, it will greatly improve the marketing conditions. The chief argument against reciprocity is that it will admit into the state farm products which will compete with the farm products of Washington. I can conceive of no Canadian farm products that will seriously interfere with us. We are not marketing our wheat in Canada; Canada can never market her wheat in this state."
