

TEAM PLUNGES OVER PRECIPICE

Narrow Escape for Driver and Friend—Buggy Demolished—Horses badly Bruised and Cut—Were Frightened.

A team of horses, driven by Mr. Redfield of the Rogue River Fruit and Produce ass'n, became frightened while on a narrow mountain road seven miles southeast of Medford, Sunday, and plunged, with the buggy and driver into a gulch below. Mr. Redfield was uninjured but the buggy and harness were destroyed and the horses were badly bruised and lacerated.

WILL START WORK ON BASE SOON

Two Large Concrete Mixers Are to Be Started on Jackson Street This Week—Curb and Gutters Are Now Laid.

Two large concrete mixing machines with a capacity of 1000 square yards a day, will be started this week on Jackson boulevard by the Clark & Henry Construction company. The concrete base will be rushed and as soon as they have made enough headway to warrant, the paving plant will be started and the surface completed.

The curb and gutter work is progressing very rapidly, the curbing having been laid nearly the entire length of Jackson. From there the gang will jump to Sixth street which has been graded. Jackson street has been cut considerably and is fast rounding into shape. When completely paved it will be one of the principle and most handsome streets in the city.

When the Clark & Henry Construction company bid last week for additional paving in this city they tendered a concrete asphaltic pavement at \$1.71 a square yard. As none of this pavement had been laid in this city the city dads expressed a desire to inspect it. For this purpose they left Sunday for Sacramento.
