

# SERIOUS EPIDEMIC KLAMATH RANGE

State Veterinarian Recommends That  
Quarantine Be Declared Against  
Exportation of Cattle From Either  
Lake or Klamath Counties

SALEM, Ore., April 25.—So serious has become an epidemic of cattle mange or scabies among range herds in Klamath and Lake counties that both Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian and state health officer, Calvin S. White have this morning recommended to Governor West that a quarantine proclamation be issued against exportation of cattle from either of those counties to other counties in this state or to other states.

Cattle scabies was introduced to the herds of the Chawaucan hills imported from Northern California. William Proudfoot, government inspector, has charge of the situation for the United States government and it is feared that unless the state authorities act the government may order a quarantine against the entire state and not against Klamath and Lake counties only.

As the winter has been severe in central Oregon and the herds are very thin, State Veterinarian Lytle says it is impracticable to dip cattle now for the reason that many are not strong enough to endure the shock or climb out of the dipping vat. They will be dipped, however, as soon as warmer weather prevails.
