

HAYWOOD SAYS MEN GUILTY

CLEVELAND, April 26.—Prediction that John J. McNamara, international secretary of the structural iron workers, and his associates would be vindicated of all connection with the Los Angeles explosions and denunciation of the methods employed in the arrests were made here today by William D. Haywood, who was acquitted of the murder of former Governor Frank Steunenburg in Idaho after a similar accusation.

For the United Press, Haywood wrote today:

The kidnaping of John J. McNamara from his offices in Indianapolis and the flight with him across the continent which is now in progress is nothing new in the class war now throughout the world. In 1906 President Chase H. Moyer of the Western Federation of Miners; Adams, Pettibone, St. John and myself, members of that organization were arrested in Colorado without a warrant, secreted temporarily and later rushed 1,000 miles to Idaho to be charged with the murder of Steunenburg.

Like McNamara, we were given no chance to confer with our friends or families or to consult with an attorney. We were imprisoned for eighteen months. Everyone knows the result of the trials. I predict that McNamara and his associates will be vindicated.

It is remarkable how easily the wheels of the court move in those instances where the workman is accused of crime and how securely the safety clutch holds when any attempt is made to prosecute the capitalist.

McNamara's case has all the earmarks of a conspiracy between the employers' associations and the detectives. So far as it has gone, it is purely a detective-made case. Detectives in labor troubles have been so thoroughly discredited that an innocent man can no longer be convicted on their evidence.

The position taken by the officers of the Western Federation of Miners in coming to the support of McNamara and his associates can be depicted upon the membership of organized labor, labor unions generally and socialists reorganizer the fact that their officials would have been railroaded to the gallows if it had not been for the solidarity of workmen at the time of the Boise trial and the general protest expressed throughout the country against such high handed proceedings.

I hope McNamara will not be forced to languish in solitary confinement on coarse food as long as were the officers of the Western Federation. The McNamaras and McManigal can rest assured that the working class of the country will see to it that they are given a fair trial.

This new chapter of the class war will have the tendency to amalgamate workmen as it did in my case. Every blow the employers deal will but serve to weld the working classes closer together.

CINCINNATI, O., April 26.—Expressing absolute confidence in the innocence of her two sons, Mrs. Mary McNamara, mother of John J. and James W. McNamara, arrested in connection with the dynamiting of the Los Angeles Times building, told the United Press today of the home life of her boys.

"How can I believe such things of my Johnny and Jimmy," she asked. "Why, Johnny has been such a good son, the very best in the world, and I have always been so proud of him. Jimmy is a good boy, too, but somehow Johnny has always been closer to me."

"Johnny was with me here Easter Sunday and took such an interest in his old mother and in things about the house. To appreciate the boy, one must know him. He is so clean, and strong, and fine."

"Oh, if I could only cry, it would be such a relief. But my trouble is too deep for tears. My suffering is fearful—simply fearful. I cannot free my mind for a second of the trouble that faces my boys."

"Wouldn't it be awful if they should hang my Johnny and Jimmy? Who can tell? They have hanged innocent men before, and only God knows what will happen to my two good boys."

APRIL SHOWS BIG INCREASE

CHICAGO, April 26.—Railroads reporting their gross earnings for the first two weeks of April show an increase of 5 per cent above the earnings of the same roads a year ago. Business for the first two weeks totaled \$12,448,862.
Slight decreases in gross earnings are shown in the D. & R. G., Kansas & Texas, Texas & Pacific and several other lines but these are more than offset by the pronounced increases of the Great Northern, St. Louis & Southwestern, Wabash and Southern and other systems.

Negroes Win Suit.
SEATTLE, April 26.—Barred from the fashionable Mount Baker park residence district because they were negroes, S. H. Stone and his wife Susie, not only defeated the efforts of the Hunter Improvement Company to annul their contract for a site but obtained a verdict for \$255 for expenses of litigation and house rent, lost owing to their being delayed in constructing their home. Both the superior and supreme courts have upheld the negroes and their home has been built despite protests of white residents of the district.
