

C. K. KLUM HAD AN ACTIVE LIFE

Sketch of Pioneer Who Passed Away Tuesday—Was in Rogue River Valley Before Single White Settler Had Located.

The Valley Record contains the following account of C. K. Klum, father of Blaine Klum of this city, who died at Ashland Tuesday: Mr. Klum was one of the earliest pioneers now living in Oregon, having come across the plains from Missouri to Soda-water, Linn county, with his father's family in the year 1847. Upon hearing of the Whitman massacre near Fort Walla Walla in 1848 he walked 75 miles to Oregon City to join a company of pioneer settlers who went to the scene to assist in relieving the disastrous situation wrought by the breaking out of the Cayuse war and served for a considerable period in guarding the emigrant trains from the hostile Indians. He was joined in his early rush consequent upon the discovery of gold in California and passed through Rogue River valley twice before there was a single white settlement in this valley. He was a telegraph operator for the Western Union Telegraph company in the early part of the line in this valley for 15 years and put in the first telephone line in Ashland after the invention was discovered. He was the first recorder of the town at its incorporation and was on the school board that located the old south school building. He went east in 1884 and after a visit in Ohio returned with the first Polled Angus calves brought to southern Oregon. About this period he moved to Talent and for nine years conducted a store at that place, after which the family moved back to Ashland. In moving from the Willamette valley to Jackson county he sold a farm there for a few stands of bees which were the first colonies brought to this county. While engaged in mining in the Sterling district near Jacksonville he met Miss Lucinda Finley and was united in marriage with her at Jacksonville, June 12, 1875. Of this union four sons and one daughter survive as follows: Mrs. Hypatia McKendree of Berkeley, Cal.; Blaine Klum of Medford and Walter Klum and Otto Klum of Ashland; C. D. Hifner of Shake is a nephew and Mrs. Ella Cooke of Jacksonville is a niece. Albert Rockefeller, aged 84, is a cousin. He is survived by a brother, George Klum, two years his senior, living at Soda-water, where also resides his stepmother, and also a step brother, Henry Klum. Another step brother, Lynn Klum, resides at Glendale. Had he lived until September 2 he would have been 82 years old. He was elected president of the Southern Oregon Pioneer society at its annual meeting.

JOE HAMMERSLEY RESIGNS FROM GOLD HILL BANK

At a meeting of the directors of the Gold Hill bank held at Gold Hill Thursday evening, the resignation of Joe Hammersley as cashier, to take effect June 1, was accepted. Lynn W. Smith of Grants Pass was elected as his successor.

For sometime Mr. Hammersley's resignation has been filed with the directors who have endeavored to induce him to remain, but other business interests caused him to leave the bank.

TALENT BANK IS SOLD BY WOLTERS

E. O. Adamson, Who Came Recently From Minnesota, Buys Out Financial Institution in Talent and Will Conduct It in the Future.

E. O. Adamson, who came to Oregon about a month ago from Delavan, Minn., has purchased of C. W. Wolters the controlling interest in the State Bank of Talent. Mr. Adamson has been considering the purchase for some time. From the start he was impressed with the future of this country, but took plenty of time to confirm his first opinion. He

intends to bring his family from Minnesota. The bank has been in existence for about two years. Mr. Wolters has acted as cashier and A. Alford as president. The new officers have not yet been chosen. The institution will soon occupy the fine, new building, which Mr. Wolters started to build after the fire of last winter. Arrangements are being made to build an addition in the shape of a large vault. It had been planned to have the vault inside the building as first planned, but it is now believed that this would not give sufficient room. The wing of the new bank building is to be occupied by Beebe and Kinney of Ashland, who will conduct a branch store at Talent.

SAN DIEGO, Cal., April 28.—While the army brigade at Point Loma is resting from its recent maneuver work at Grossmont and vicinity, it is momentarily expected a rush order to march. General Bliss steadfastly refuses to announce where and when he will order the brigade to march.

AGED PASTOR GUILTY, IS PARDONED BY HAY

SEATTLE, Wash., April 28.—Before formal sentence had been passed and before Rev. E. B. Sutton, assistant pastor of a Presbyterian church, saw the inside of the penitentiary under conviction for election frauds, Governor Hay issued a pardon. Sutton, 66 years old, faced a term of one to five years. He was prosecuted by followers of Hiram C. Gill, recalled as mayor, for having taken a sick woman's deposition and registered for her. He was technically guilty, but his record in the Union army in the civil war coupled with his church connections, enlisted friends in a fight to save him. He has retained his pastorate, the church standing by him.
