### YOUNG MAN HAS NARROW ESCAPE

Thrown From Wheel and Run Over by Automobile Man Escapes Death -Shoulder Dislocated-Is Badly Injured.

Waterman turned to the right as the rules of driving require but upon seeing the bicycle rider turned to the left again as did Miller and the two left again as did Miller and the two crashed together not ten feet from the south curbing. Miller was thrown di-rectly between the front wheels and it is a mystery how he ever passed un-der the front exle. He was forced through in some way and rolled head over heals under the machine striking his back and head furious blows against the bottom o fthe machine and the pavement. Waterman applied his brakes immediately and brought his car to a stand still and went to the assistance of the injured man. Miller was taken immediately to the office of Dr. Stearns where he was found to be badly bruised about the body and his right shoulder dislocated. His ciothes were badly torn and his scale was severely becomed and his scalp was severly lacerated.
