
SALEM. Or., May 6.—Master Fish den Clanton today submitted his report for April to the board of fish commis-shoners. Inasmuch as it will be necessary to secure salmon eggs for the Youngs river hatchery, the warden is making arrangements to rack the Middle fork of the Willamette river eight miles above Lowell, in Lane county, and racks will also be installed in the Santiam river, with a view of taking chinook salmon spawn during the coming season. The report shows the receipts for the department for April to be \$10,982, while the disbursements total \$5288.
