

MUCH DOING AT CRESCENT CITY

Representative of Commercial Club States That There is no Doubt But That Railroad From Interior is to be Constructed to Connect.

D. G. Donahue, representing the Del Norte county commercial club, arrived in the city Saturday from Portland and Seattle, which cities he has been visiting in connection with interests of the commercial club.

Mr. Donahue states that things look very promising for a railroad connecting the city with the coast at Crescent City. All commercial eyes of the Pacific northwest are at present focused on that city and plans are now contemplated and in existence which will connect the city through a route that city the commercial center of coast cities outside of Prisco and Portland.

"There is no question in my mind," said Mr. Donahue, "about a railroad going to Crescent City, in fact, plans are now being made and contemplated along that line which if carried through will give this vast inland empire an outlet to the coast within a period of two years. At present the Hill interests are making preparations to continue the trunk line through central Oregon, which will, when completed, connect with Klamath Falls, Medford, Grants Pass and from there to the coast at Crescent City. This work is being held up at the present time on account of the agitation and rate cases against the railroads. These rate cases must be decided before the route of the Pacific northwest will outlay any more money for railroad extensions. If the Hill interests start constructing I firmly believe, from information received from many sources, that the Southern Pacific will follow shortly. It is simply a game of one watch the other. Neither want to make the move until compelled by the other."


