

# JURY FINDS WOMAN GUILTY

Asserted That Painter Killed Himself But Jury After all Night Session Returns a Verdict of Manslaughter.

GUILDHALL, Vt., May 13.—After having deliberated all night, the jury hearing the case of Mrs. Florence Dodge, widow of former Sheriff Dodge, charged

with killing William Heath, a painter, while he was at work at her home near Lunenburg, last September, returned a verdict of manslaughter. Mrs. Dodge asserted that Heath killed himself either intentionally or accidentally.

**Wife Dopes Field; Divorced.**  
SEATTLE, Wash., May 13.—In his counter suit, accusing his wife of using opium, drugs and liquor, G. Ward Kemp, an attorney, was granted a divorce from Charlotte Leslie Kemp, with custody of two children. Mrs. Kemp instituted suit charging cruelty and subduing her to the point of a nonentity. Kemp filed a cross complaint and introduced evidence that his wife's parents frequented his home and joined his wife in carousals. Community property valued at \$50,000 is yet to be disposed of.

**Negro Politician in Trouble.**  
SEATTLE, Wash., May 13.—Charged with false registration, Oscar Collins, a negro political boss in the old restricted area, was arrested in his saloon. After delay he gave \$3000 bail. Collins first was arrested on recall election day when he affirmed he had not lost his citizenship rights. An information was filed charging that he had been a convict, but the details were not given and Collins escaped on a demurrer. Since then the information has been supplemented that he served time in Missouri in 1889.

**Taft Is Quoted.**  
SEATTLE, Wash., May 13.—In overruling a demurrer by the city council in the suit of the Seattle Renton & Southern railway to prevent revoking of a franchise, Judge Donworthy quoted in support a decision by President Taft when he was on the circuit bench. It was argued that the federal court had no jurisdiction; that the point as to whether the company had lived up to its franchise agreement was subject for the state court. Judge Donworthy said President Taft had penned a decision clearly establishing that the federal court had jurisdiction.

# DEVELOPMENT OF TIMBER TO WAIT

Railroad Must Reach Timber, Says Mercereau Before They Can Start Manufacturing in Tract Near This City.

W. B. Mercereau, president of the Big Axe Lumber company, the Rogue River Lumber company and manager of the syndicate owning the Wheeler and other large tracts of timber in the Butte Creek and upper Rogue river country, arrived Friday to look after business interests here. "We are very anxious to operate," stated Mr. Mercereau, "but conditions will not permit it at present. The railroad is not yet extended through our timber, there is no way of getting it to eastern markets. Then, in addition, the present depression in the lumber market does not make manufacturing inviting. "However, just as soon as possible, we intend to operate, and our only regret is that we cannot do it at once, to utilize the timber burned last summer. By another year we hope the railroad will have been extended."

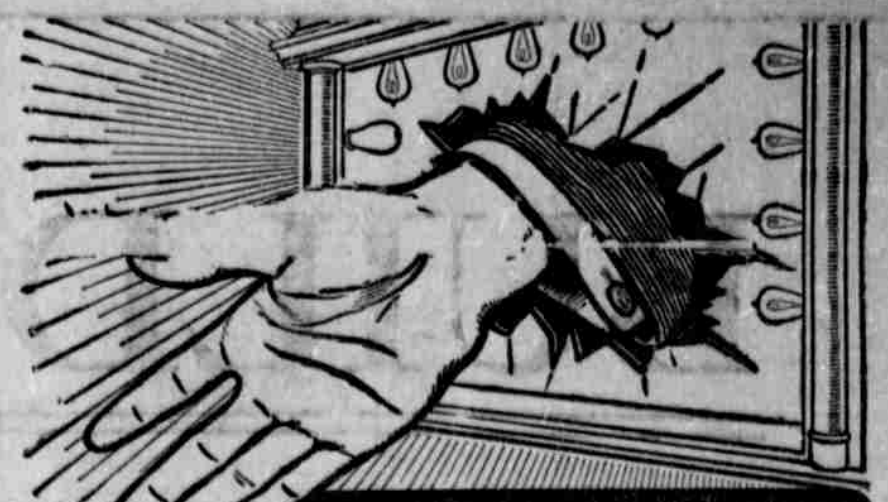
