

MARBLE CAVE IS DISCOVERED

Prospectors on Upper Deer Creek Find Winding Caverns—One Cave is Said to Be Forty Feet From Floor to Roof.

GRANTS PASS, OR., May 17.—C. W. Walker, local prospector near Dryden, and H. C. Perkins, ex-county surveyor, have discovered a marble cave on upper Deer creek 25 miles south of this place and in the vicinity of the famous Josephine county caves.

Mr. Perkins and his companion were prospecting to locate several claims for a Portland firm when they accidentally discovered the winding lava and underground regions of the earth beneath their excavations. Little exploration work was made as but one candle was all the light they had. The opening to the new caves is not large, but insides are deep marble recesses.

One cave is 40 feet high, and several tunnels enter from different directions. A party soon to be formed here will inspect the new caves.

In the underground passages the bones of bear and elk were found. An ivory spearhead five inches long, and an arrowhead were also found.

Large scale, say at least 10 acres or so, in some conspicuous location close to the city, where the operations and results could be easily viewed by other residents of the valley, and production by ranchers and orchardists of an increasing volume of strictly first quality vegetables and other farm products be thoroughly stimulated and directed along.

Would Make Money.

There can be no question that such an enterprise would yield a handsome financial return, and that with modern methods of intensive cultivation and irrigation, supplied with abundant water for irrigation, a most noteworthy exhibition could be made. L. A. Luther and L. H. Miller, representatives of the local cannery, who were present, were questioned as to the amount of produce which their institution would be likely to require for this year, and it was agreed that the cannery men stated that they had already contracted for some 30 tons of cabbages suitable for kraft, the Danish ball-head variety, at the rate of \$11 per ton, and for 15 tons of tomatoes at the rate of \$12.50 per ton, which would represent the production of about eight and 15 acres respectively, and that there would be a demand for a thousand tons of tomatoes this season at the price named if growers would come forward and enter into an agreement with them. They stated that the cannery had been operated last year, the first of its existence, almost entirely without the use of machinery, primitive hand labor, and yet that it had made a profit, producing at the rate of 1000 cans per day. This year a complete layout of machinery has been ordered, and will be installed at an early date, sufficient to insure a production of 10,000 cans per day, with capacity to increase the production to over 100,000 cans per day, provided for the money expended for Clanton's return ticket. Clanton says he recently came to Medford from Redding, Cal.

According to the Portland Telegram the man who "walked right in and turned around and walked right out again" was George W. Clayton, an almost helpless pauper, 78 years of age, who arrived in that city from Jackson county Saturday. He was supplied with return transportation by the county court and took the next train south. Multnomah Advises Local County Court to Keep Its Paupers at Home

GRANTS PASS, OR., May 17.—Last winter J. C. Davis came to this city and opened a real estate office in land office style. He advertised extensively and claimed to be doing a large business. However, he left without announcing the fact last Sunday morning for the south. He had a number of contracts, and with bills for milk, wood and advertising. He also took the contract to sell an addition recently platted, the understanding being that he was to deposit the proceeds of the sale of lots to the credit of the owner of the addition in one of the banks. It is now alleged that he sold part of the lots but forgot to deposit any of the proceeds to the bank, carrying 300 passengers pulled into the yards at Bryn Mawr, near here.

Rebel Shows Up.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 17.—As the result of a boisterous explosion on the head engine on the Southern Pacific passenger train, which occurred this afternoon with a picked crew of 16 men and Captain Burts at the helm.

The announced destination of the vessel is Alameda, California, but the men who made up her crew say that the helm is set for the coast of Salvador.

The sailors say they picked for strength and nerve, and those who accompanied them might be afraid of risking their lives were exposed from signing. They receive 20 per cent more than the usual seamen's wage.

The vessel was outfitted by J. C. McLean, a Los Angeles capitalist, and two others.

Japs Abrogate Treaty.

OTTAWA, Ont., May 17.—Mr. Fielding, minister of finance, has given notice of a resolution bearing on the trade treaty with Japan in which Canada participated with the other country. The Japanese government has given notice of its intention to abrogate the treaty and the Canadian government asks the authority of parliament to extend to Japan for a period not exceeding two years a reciprocal tariff, provided Japan extends similar treatment to imports from this country.

Other Vegetables Also.
