CANNERY HAS A BIG SEASON

Many Tons of Vegetables are Contracted For—Roguelands to Deliver Cucumbers and Tomatoes—Contracts Are Made.

Indications that the Rogue River Cannery and Evaporating Company will be worked to its full capacity are evident from the amount of garden truck already contracted for.

The Roguelands Company has contracted for one acre of cucumbers and five acres of tomatoes on their tract at Roguelands. All told twenty acres of tomatoes are already under contract with the cannery company and other tracts are scattered throughout the valley.

WOODROW WILSON'S CAMPAIGN

It is announced, with a great waste of newspaper space, that Woodrow Wilson will spend two days in Oregon studying the effect of popular legislation.

The knowledge that he thereby obtains will be as valuable as that secured of a country from a car window. He will go back to New Jersey with the same amount of "local color" that many of our near writers exhibit when picturing life in the great west after chasing across it like a sky rocket.

Woodrow Wilson is a presidential possibility. He has been touted for the place for some six or eight years or more by Harpers Weekly, owned by J. Pierpont Morgan. He has been endorsed by Wm. J. Bryan, and it must be admitted that the combination is a strong one.

Governor Wilson is tenderly and kindly treated by the plutocratic press of New York City, which is thrown into hysterics at mention of Bryan, and enthusiastically championed by the Bryan democratic press, which knifed the late eminent jurist, Alton B. Parker.

Wilson's reception by republican papers is suspiciously warm. Even the hide-bound Oregonian places him above Thomas Jefferson as a statesman.

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Fifteen years ago Bryan was shouting for the initiative and referendum. He was denounced as a "crazy populist."

Bryan was caricatured as a fool, and a jester, ridiculed as a buffoon, misrepresentation and abuse descended in a torrent upon him.

The Mail Tribune, along with every other newspaper in the country, recently received free of plate concerning Woodrow Wilson.

It is to be hoped that Governor Wilson's study of direct legislation in Oregon, will convince him of the desirability of giving the people full power, state and nationally.

Governor Wilson has so far made a good record. If his presidential campaign is at present financed by Wall Street, it probably will not be at the show down.
