Woodrow Wilson is a presidential possibility. He has been touted for the place for some six or eight years or more by Harpers Weekly, owned by J. Pierpont Morgan. He has been endorsed by Wm. J. Bryan, and it must be of the estate of walter C. Gardiner, wa admitted that the combination is a strong one.

Governor Wilson is tenderly and kindly treated by the plutocratic press of New York City, which is thrown into hysteries at mention of Bryan, and enthusiasticly championed by the Bryan democratic press, which knifed the brought the suit following Mr. Gardiner late eminent jurist, Alton B. Parker.

Wilson's reception by republican papers is suspiciously wreck he visited Portland and wa warm. "He has Jefferson's wide out-look and more than his scholarship. He has the same marvelous understanding of opportunity and readiness to seize upon it, the same contempt for mere traditional ideas and established formulas. He is a man who is in tune with his age. Intellectually alert, with the stars for pilots, he addresses himself bravely to sail the seas of democracy, fearless of wreck, confident of reaching happier shores than man ever trod." Who would have thought it from the Oregonian!

Fifteen years ago Bryan was shouting for the initiative and referendum. He was denounced as a "crazy populist." He championed the recall. He was a "bomb throw-ing anarchist." He favored popular election of senators. He was a "dangerous demagogue." But Woodrow Wilson following in Bryan's foot steps, advocating these same things, is "piloted by the stars" and "in tune with his age." He is proclaimed greater than Jefferson-he has 'the statesman's grasp" and "the philosopher's understanding."

Bryan was caricatured as a fool, and a jester, ridiculed as a buffoon, misrepresentation and abuse descended in a torrent upon him. But upon Woodsaw Wilson these same persons place the mantle of Solomon and chanting praises, humbly fawn upon him.

This consisted of six columns of reading matter, with pictures of our hero in repose and in action, stories of his personality, beliefs and performances. Every newspaper in the land has been supplied in advance with copies of his numerous speeches in his swing around the circle. In fact, his publicity bureau is as good or better than Roosevelt's, and equal to that of the "Sage of Esopus" who also ran. It has cost a good many thousands of dollars to thus inform the public and it would be interesting to know who pays for it.

If Governor Wilson believes, as he says, that the salva tion of the world depends upon the rule of the people, why does he fear to trust the people with the recall of the judiciary? Has not the history of the United States shown that the courts are all powerful? Have they not constantly overridden the wishes of the people as expressed by legislation? Have they not arrograted to themselves greater powers than even congress or the executive or the people possess? Do they not even modify and nullify laws after their passage, by reading in words, as in the Standard Oil decision? Are not courts all too frequently, controlled by political bosses, financed by corporations? Is not a decision often the price paid for nomination and election-What have the criminal rich to fear from law breaking or law making, when they can control the courts which make and unmake the laws? And finally, does not an outraged public opinion always force a court to revise itself—an indirect referendum?

It is to be hoped that Governor Wilson's study of direct legislation in Oregon, will convince him of the desirability of giving the people full power, state and nationally, to nominate, elect and recall all officials, administrative, executive and judicial, and to initiate or referend any legislation enacted by the people's representatives in state or

Governor Wilson has so far made a good record. If his presidential campaign is at present financed by Wall Street, it probably will not be at the show down. He did not deliver the goods to the political boss who made him governor, and as president, he probably would follow the
