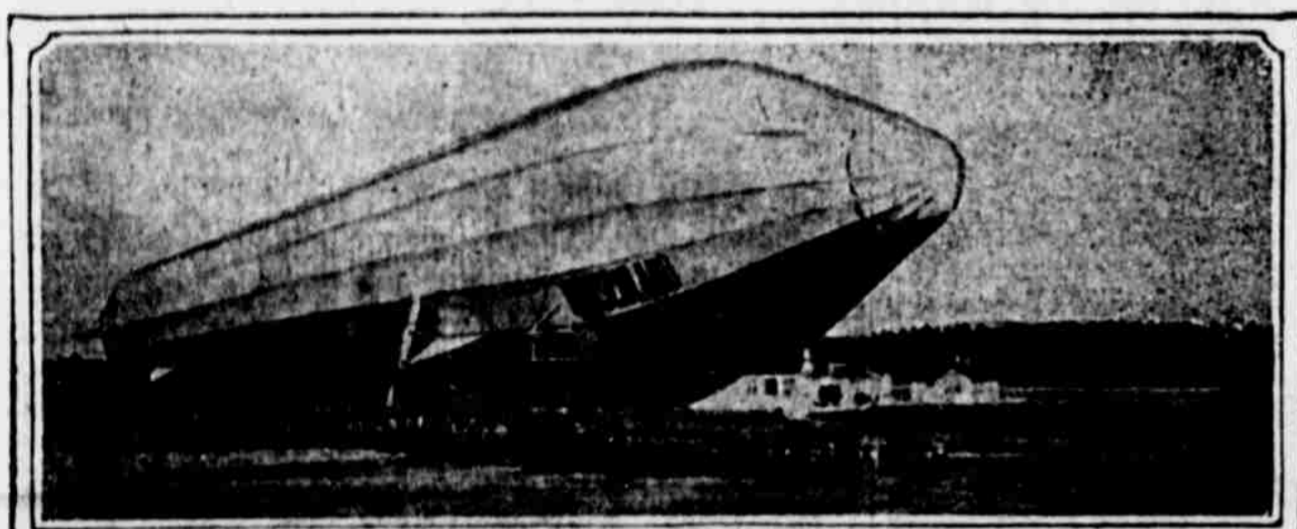

Latest of Zeppelin's Great Airships Is Wrecked

DUESSELDORF, Rhineland Prussia, May 22.—After a career of six weeks the Deutschland II, latest of the models of Count Zeppelin's ill fated dirigible balloons, stranded on the roof of its shed, a complete wreck. The finish of the airship was less spectacular than that of its predecessors, but more complete. The crew and passengers escaped injury.

COMSTOCK STILL PROTECTING GIRLS

As Result of His Endeavors Several Men Are Now Serving Sentences—Is Lending a Helping Hand to Working Girls.

NEW YORK, May 22.—Anthony Comstock, who is never happy unless on the trail of some social offender, is busy in a new tack these days; the punishment of men who seek to prey on girls advertising for employment in the daily papers. As a result of his labors several such men are now enjoying life in the federal prison at Atlanta and a number of others are awaiting trial on the charge of improper use of the mails. Anthony always sets his trap so that it will involve this latter charge, the punishment being severer and more certain.

Comstock declares that there is a small army of moral leeches in New York, who make a regular business of sending fraudulent answers to advertisements in the "Situations Wanted" column.

A few days ago an orphan girl came to Comstock with a letter she had received in answer to her advertisement. It suggested that she meet the writer at a certain corner, as he had a proposition by which both could make money. Comstock asked her if she was brave enough to keep the appointment, provided he himself kept only a few feet in the rear. She agreed and the capture of the man was effected with the utmost ease. He is now serving 18 months in Atlanta.

Comstock says that if girls who are thus victimized and that still larger class who innocently answer the misleading advertisements of evil men would in all cases come to him with their complaints, it would not be long before the city could be practically rid of such offenders.

"Too many girls have the impression that they will become involved in unpleasant notoriety by exposing these men," he said. "I want these girls to know that they can trust the Society for the Suppression of Vice implicitly. It will never divulge information given to it in confidence, and it is in a position to see that no harm comes to a girl who helps it run down these leeches."

GRANDSON OF HANNA HONORED

Captain Lockland is the Only Officer of National Guard to Pass Examinations and is Commissioned a Second Lieutenant in Regular Army.

Captain Frank D. Lockland, the only officer of the Washington, D. C. District National Guard to pass the examination given recently by the Federal Government at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., and who has been informed of his appointment as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army, is a son of Mrs. Katherine Lockland, formerly of Jacksonville, and a grandson of the late Judge H. K. Hanna, of Southern Oregon. The Washington Post says of him:

"Captain Lockland is one of the best known of the younger officers of the District National Guard. When he left high school a few years ago he enlisted in the militia and it was but a short time till he had passed an examination for a commission. He received a Second Lieutenantcy and later on promotion to First Lieutenant.

"For the last several months he has held a Captaincy, and has commanded Company E. He has occupied prominent positions on the brigade rifle team and on the Congress Heights rifle range, where the militia is taught to shoot, and has made several records as a marksman."

WOLF CREEK MINE IS PURCHASED

Mill Will Probably Be Constructed on Property in Near Future—Sixty Acres Are Owned in the Tract to Be Developed.

After a careful inspection of the Clark mine located about seven miles from Wolf creek, Josephine county, Oregon, Lamar Nelson, a well known Salt Lake mining man made a deal with C. C. Clark of Medford, Or., for property controlled by him. The property is located about one mile from the Greenback mine, which has had a remarkable production of four million dollars, also being close to the Marshall, Columbia and Martha properties which have also produced heavily.

Mr. Nelson proposes to have business headquarters for his proposition at Medford, and to have development work started in the near future, also to interest eastern parties in constructing a mill on the property as soon as possible. The main vein on the property is exposed for about 300 feet, and is developed so far by tunneling of about 150 feet, and from five samples Mr. Nelson received an average return of \$48.88 per ton. By systematic development the property should make another big proposition in that district.
