WAR IN STEEL PRICES PREDICTED

Republic Iron and Steel Company Severs All Connections With United Steel Corporation and Goes After Business Independently.

NEW YORK, May 23.—A big war in steel prices is expected as the result of an announcement here today that the Republic Iron and Steel company has severed all connection with the United States Steel corporation (the trust) and will solicit business on its own terms in the future.

Chairman Topping of the Republic company's board of directors charges his concern was shabbily treated by the trust and that the plan to smash the "gentleman's agreement" long subsisting and to go it alone meets the approval of his whole directorate.

RESUME ISSUED OF ALASKA COAL CASES

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 24.—Fred Dennett, commissioner of the general land office, issued today a resume of the Alaskan coal situation to date. Of 1,798 claims 640 have resulted in cases against the filers, one is before the United States supreme court and more than 100 have been held up because of the unfavorable reports of government agents. The remaining 344 claims are now being investigated.

CAR OF MONUMENTS MADE IN MEDFORD

A car of monuments manufactured from southern Oregon granite, valued at \$4000 has just been shipped by a local granite company over the Sierras to California where it will be distributed. A large stone valued at nearly \$1000 has just been shipped to Boise, Idaho, and another to Honolulu, T. H., which tends to show that the fame of the local granite used in monumental works is spreading rapidly over the country. Two carloads of manufactured stone were recently shipped to northern points in the state.

CHIEF COX ACQUITTED OF MALFEASANCE CHARGE

PORTLAND, Or., May 24.—Acquitted of the charge of malfeasance of office, it is believed probable that Chief Cox will return to his duties in the near future. Chief Cox today declined to speak of his future plans in this regard.

The charges against Cox resulted from a crusade of disorderly houses and it was alleged that he refused to close them. Following his indictment by the grand jury Cox resigned temporarily.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 24.—Henry L. Stimson of New York is prominently mentioned here today as a possible running mate for President Taft in the campaign of 1912. Taft, it is said, fully expects to renominate, and his friends and advisers, in casting about for a man to head the ticket with him, are said to favor stimson, both for geographical and personal reasons.
