

BLETHEN INDICTED BY GRAND JURY

Editor of Seattle Times and His Son Accused of Grafting in Connection With Dance Hall Proprietors—Two Indictments Are Found.

SEATTLE, Wash., May 21.—Blethen, president of the Times Publishing company, his son, Clarence B. Blethen, managing editor of the Times and Chauncey Hathorn, city editor, were returned by the grand jury yesterday and turned over to the sheriff's office for service.

Two indictments charged Colonel Blethen with conspiracy with Charles Berryman and Ludovic Dalliogavina, owners of the Alaska bar and the Arcade dance hall, which was finally closed by the police after agitation.

Another indictment against the elder Blethen and Hathorn charge libel. A fourth indictment against Colonel Blethen charges conspiracy.

Three indictments charge ex-Chief of Police Wapenstien, who went out of office with Mayor Gill, with receiving bribes.

The last indictment is against Police Captain Mike Powers, who was Wapenstien's right hand man.
