BATTLESHIP WYOMING LAUNCHED AT CRAMPS

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., May 27.—The battleship Wyoming was launched at the Cramps shipyards here at 12:06 p. m. Thursday. Miss Dorothy Knight, daughter of former Chief Justice Knight of the Wyoming supreme court christened the big ship as it slipped from the ways into the water.

The Wyoming is 550 feet long. Her waterline breadth is 93 feet. She has a displacement of 26,000 tons and is capable of a speed of 20 1/2 knots. She carries a complement of 1030 men and 54 officers.

NAMES OF PAROLED CONVICTS KEPT SECRET

SALEM, Ore., May 27.—Following the plan which proved so successful in California, the new prison board, it was learned today, will keep the names of all paroled prisoners secret in the future with a view of giving them a chance to start life anew without publicity of his record.

James Linn, a member of the board said: "We have decided not to give out the names of paroled convicts any more because it would be unjust to both men and families to do so and it detracts from their opportunity to work back into a position in the world."
