

ELY MAKES A GREAT FLIGHT

Humboldt Times Tells of Man Bird's Flights Over the Ocean at Eureka—Is a Thrilling Spectacle as He Mounts in Gale.

(Humboldt Times.) An aeroplane, the most startling achievement of modern times, has soared above the borders of Humboldt county and hovered over the breakers of the Pacific Ocean.

The speed with which the aeroplane left the ground and attained a height at which its fearless pilot of the air could be distinguished was indeed startling.

Once in the air and at a height estimated at between 800 and 1000 feet by the aviator himself, the aeroplane, its motor sending forth an unbroken rattle from its exhaust, the propeller churning the air with a "swish" which grew into a roar whenever the aviator passed over the heads of the breathless spectators, held to its course.

BUTTER ALL COMES FROM SAME TUB

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 1.—The only difference in various standard brands of butter is the paper wrapper and the name, according to the testimony of Walter Grush, a produce dealer before Judge Evans, special commissioner in a suit to dissolve the Kansas City Fruit & Produce exchange on the ground that it is an illegal combination.

Grush said that practically all the butter sold by retailers was purchased in tubs in carload lots then taken to the warehouses of the big distributors and there molded into packages and given a name.

"It is funny how some people get stuck on one brand and will not have another," said Grush. "When all of the butter comes from the same tub."
