This appropriation and the revenues derived from the lands will be used to support the station for agricultural experiment in southern Or

The act provides that the \$5000 o any part thereof shall not be used for building purposes and an additions appropriation will have to be mad for this purpose.

The board of regents have beeauthorized to allow the station to co operate with the federal experimentadepartments in any special line o.
