C., June 6.-Following the beginning of an investigation at Chicago of the lumber trust, it was learned at the White House today that the steel trust will be the next combination in restraint of trade to be attacked by the government, Action against the steel trust is to begin this summer.

Herbert Knox Smith, commissioner of the bureau of corporations will soon submit to President Taft the report of his bureau's investigation into the business and methods of the United States Steel corporation.


