LONDON, June 14.—Jack Johnson continues to be the coronation. Following the usual demonstration yesterday when the husky champion arrived to attend the big show, London today is still showering honors on the negro. No visiting potentate ever attracted half the attention that Johnson has received. At every appearance today enormous crowds have followed him about and even the well trained London police have found a traffic problem that has kept them guessing. At noon in Leicester Square the crowd was so dense that reserve constables were summoned to force a way through for Jack's automobile.

The pugilist, silk hatted and wrapped in an automobile duster, drove the car himself, constantly displaying the golden smile as the crowds cheered him. At Piccadilly a group of girls stopped Jack's car and presented him with a bouquet. The champion removed his tie, stood in the seat of his car and made a brief address of thanks.

**ORDINANCE No. 512.**  
An ordinance authorizing the entering into a contract on behalf of the City of Medford, Oregon, for improving curving and paving certain streets of said city, with the Clark and Henry Construction Company, a California Corporation.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. The mayor and recorder of the City of Medford are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract on behalf of the City of Medford, Oregon, with the Clark and Henry Construction Company, a California Corporation, hereininafter called the contractor, for the improvement, paving, curbing and installing intersecting sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drains, manholes, and other works of material pertaining thereto on the streets and portions of streets, and for the widthening of the same.

Witnesseth: That the said contractor for and in consideration of the payments to be made and the covenants to be kept by the city hereininafter set forth, the contractor agrees to furnish to furnish all materials and do all the work of excavating, filling, paving with asphalt, curbing and installing intersecting sidewalks, curbs, gutters, drains, manholes, and other works of material pertaining thereto on the streets and portions of streets, and for the widthening of the same.
