

TAFT WANTS LAW AMENDED

Pure Food and Drug Act Is Without Value Claims Chief Executive—Sends Message to Congress Regarding It.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 22.—Denouncing false statements of the curative properties of patent medicines, President Taft today sent a message to congress, urging an emergency amendment prohibiting such deceptions on the label of proprietary medicines.

More than 150 of these cases, he said, must be dismissed under a ruling of the supreme court of the United States holding that under the statute such false claims could not be construed as misbranding.

"An evil, menacing the general health of the people, strikes at the nation's life," the message says. "The sale of dangerous drugs constitutes such an evil."

LONDON TO HAVE BIG FIGHT ARENA

Hugh McIntosh Plans to Erect Greatest Arena in the World Where He Will Stage the Biggest Sporting Events.

LONDON, June 22.—Backed by the "sporting nobility" of England, Hugh McIntosh, the Australian fight promoter, proposes to give London the greatest arena in the world, in which he expects to stage only pugilistic contests of international importance.

Realizing that to be successful in the promotion of prize fighting in England he would have to overcome the prestige of the National Sporting club, McIntosh, when he began giving fights at Olympia a year ago, went to the undreamed trouble and expense of importing fighters from America and Australia.

This plan is to form what is known in amusements circles as a "wheel." Contracts will be made with the best fighters in the world to "make the circuit" each man being signed for two battles in London, two in Paris and two in Australia.
