KAISER SENDS SHIP TO AFRICA

Gives Out Notice That He Will Occupy Moroccan Port—Powers Protesting Situation Could Lead to War Say Officials.

TANGIER, July 1.—The German minister today notified the Sultan that the Kaiser intends to occupy Adeger, the southernmost port of Morocco. The gunboat Panther will be stationed at the port to enforce the demands of the Kaiser. The movement is interpreted to mean that Germany is to break into the Morocco situation. It foreshadows the collapse of the Algerian treaty.

PARIS, July 1.—France is indignant tonight over the report that Germany has issued a statement saying that her citizens need protection. This is ridiculed. Officials assert that unless Germany is blocked she will occupy Morocco. The strongest pressure has already been brought to bear on England and Spain to protect the action of the Kaiser. The officials admit that the situation is strained and that it could lead to war.
