

## BOXED APPLE EXPORTS DOUBLE

Over Million Boxes Shipped From New York and Boston Last Year to British and European Markets as Against 500,000 Previous Year.

Exports of boxed apples from New York and Boston for the season 1910-11 aggregated 1,106,610 boxes, as compared with 530,734 boxes during the previous season, according to figures compiled by Mahlon Terhune, freight broker and forwarding agent. Of this amount, Liverpool received 361,268 boxes; London, 501,064; Glasgow, 94,465; Hamburg, 77,981; Bremen, 18,386, and the balance to various other places.

Boston shipped to Liverpool 59,612 boxes; to London, 49,273; to Glasgow, 16,928, and to Manchester 29,817. The total exports surpassed all records since 1899, the nearest approach being the season of 1909-10.

The heaviest quantity exported from New York was on October 15, 1910, when 73,329 boxes were shipped. Of these, Liverpool got 15,766; London, 499,156; Glasgow, 1110, and Hamburg, 7297 boxes. The nearest approach to this was on November 12, 1910, when 67,626 boxes were exported. London led, getting 46,392 boxes; Hamburg third with 3389; Glasgow next with 3000, while Bremen got only 1289 boxes.

## FIRECRACKERS CAUSE BLAZE

Nearly 100 Cords of Wood Destroyed On Griffin Creek — Volunteer Fighters Have Difficult Time to Get Flames Under Control.

Fourth of July celebrators returning home Tuesday from Medford were responsible for a destructive fire in the Griffin creek district. Nearly 100 cords of wood owned by Will Gore, which had just been cut by John Davis, were burned and several acres of brush and grass were burned over. The fire would have destroyed additional property had not a force of volunteer fire fighters headed by Arthur Pelton checked the progress of the flames. The fire was started by a careless handling of firecrackers. A large bunch was thrown into a pile of dead brush and the fire started at once. No effort was made by the party to stamp it out.

## GOLD SEEKERS LEAVE FOR HILLS

Sterling Road, Infrequently Traveled, Is Now Being Used by Many Prospectors—Some Go in Autos, Some in Wagons, and Some With Burros.

The road to Sterling up Griffin creek which has of late years been used almost exclusively by old man Nelson and woodchoppers, has recently witnessed a great deal of traffic. Griffin Creekers are putting much faith in a mining revival and base that faith on the large number of prospectors, some in wagons, some in autos and some with the tried and trusted burro, who pass daily along the road to lose themselves in the hills where they hope to find a golden realization of their dreams.

"During the past two weeks each day has seen a number of prospectors traveling this road," stated a Griffin Creek rancher this morning, "and all seem to be equipped for a lengthy stay in the hills. Some are grizzled veterans, and others are evidently 'tenderfeet' to judge from their outfits. The movement is all the more noticeable inasmuch as the road has been little traveled of late years save by old man Nelson and woodchoppers."
