> Germany, for instance, is not the greatest beer-drinking country in the world, as might have been expected. Belgium holds the record, with 46 Germany's 22 gallons. Bavaria, however, taken separately from the with 50.6 gallons. As a whole, Germany is not even second on the list. Englishmen drink 26.2 gallons apiece. The United States record is only 16.5 gallons, or less than either Belgium, England, Germany or Denmark.

> As drinkers of spirits, Americans rank after Denmark, Germany, Holland, Austria and France, being tied with Sweden at 1.14 gallons apiece. As wine drinkers the French lead the world, with 34.5, gallons.




